## Seminar on Forestry and our Cultural Heritage to be held in Sunne, Värmland County, Sweden from 13 to 15 June 2005

The seminar is organised by the Swedish Authorities under the joint auspices of the Joint Experts Network and the Ministerial Conference on the Protection of Forests in Europe (MCPFE).

While forest practices have improved cultural heritage sites, many are still at risk from poorly planned forestry operations. There is a need to raise awareness of the cultural values, both inside and outside the forestry sector. It is also well established that cultural values of forests can serve to spark the interest of forest owners and encourage them to look at the wider issue of nature conservation.
