Cooperation with other organizations and Economic Commission for Europe bodies

Submitted by the Secretariat

I. Introduction

1. This document maps cooperation arrangements under the Economic Commission for Europe (ECE) sub-programme on trade during 2017. The first part provides an overview of collaborative efforts with development partners, while the second features a detailed account of the areas and cooperation mechanisms underpinning these efforts.
2. Sections implemented by the United Nations Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business (UN/CEFACT) are for information only.

Part One

II. Agricultural Quality Standards

3. ECE continues to pool efforts with the UN Economic Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) in implementing the United Nations Development Account (UNDA) project for strengthening the capacity of transition and developing economies to participate in cross-border agricultural food supply chains.¹ In September 2017, ECE and ESCAP

organized the first cross-regional Workshop on promoting cross-border trade of meat and electronic certification in Nanjing and Tianjin, China to assist private and public sector stakeholders in implementing ECE agricultural quality standards as well as electronic certification to facilitate and enhance the sustainable trade in meat.

4. ECE continued to work closely with the European Commission to maintain the complete harmonization of marketing standards with ECE standards. It also cooperated with the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) Scheme for the Application of International Standards for Fruit and Vegetables to facilitate the common interpretation of ECE standards and their application in international trade. It also cooperates with the Codex Alimentarius Committees on Fresh Fruits and Vegetables and on Processed Fruits and Vegetables in developing commercial quality standards and maintaining existing standards.

5. ECE is working closely with UN countries teams in Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. It has organized jointly with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and donor agencies a cross-border workshop on fresh fruit and vegetables in Tashkent (Uzbekistan) and a workshop and practical training on meat markets (Dublin, Ireland). UNDP also helped with the organization of the Farmers' Market on ECE's 70th anniversary to promote and display production and its relation to ECE standards. The country teams were also vital in disseminating and promoting UNECE's work in this area to substantiate their work on the ground. It also organized joint activities with the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) on Rooting for Sustainable Food and the Reduction of Food Loss (November 2017).

6. Cooperation is on-going with ITC on the dissemination and development of training material for sustainable trade of agricultural produce as well as with the WTO Standards and Trade Development Facility (WTO STDF) in the areas of meat standards, traceability and food safety.

7. Cooperation has also started with the Asian Development Bank (ADB) on the cross-regional use of methodologies for the analysis of documentary and procedural gaps in their agricultural trade with ECE countries and among themselves, the development of domestic and export market built on safe and quality food and the use of the WP.7's work in this area.

III. Regulatory Cooperation and Standardization Policies

A. Cooperation with the International Organizations

8. Through the Working Party on Regulatory Cooperation and Standardization Policies (WP.6), ECE is a permanent observer at the WTO Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT). ECE participated in all the meetings and provides the Committee with updates on its activities and the emerging needs of ECE member States. The WTO Secretariat has also taken part in several of the annual sessions and events of the Working Party.

9. As part of its cooperation with OECD, ECE participated in the fourth Meeting of International Organisations on partnership on for effective international rule-making in April 2017 in Paris, as well as in the brainstorming session of the core group of the Partnership in November 2017.

10. WP.6 collaborated with International Trade Centre (ITC) in the area of gender-responsive standards initiative. The first meeting took place in April 2017 at ITC headquarters in Geneva. Further cooperation is planned with ITC programme "Trade for

Sustainable Development – T4SD” in reviewing its database of voluntary sustainability standards to improve its criteria related to gender equality.

11. ECE works closely with United Nations Office for Disaster Risk Reduction (UNISDR) to promote the implementation of international standards for supporting the reduction of disaster risks. The secretary of the Working Party acts as the focal point for Disaster Risk Reduction, and advocates the use of ECE best practice guidelines and recommendations to support the implementation of the Sendai Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction. ECE co-organised with UNISDR a round-table on SDG 11 “Sustainable Cities and Communities” during the Regional Forum on Sustainable Development for the UNECE Region in March 2018.

12. ECE is also cooperating with United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD). The secretary of SCTCS took part of the Expert Meeting on Voluntary Sustainability Standards, Market Access and Trade-led Sustainable development in September 2017 as discussant. ECE also collaborated with UNCTAD Consultative Group on Enterprise Reporting and the Sustainable Development Goals (ISAR) on core indicators for enterprise reporting on the SDGs.

13. The ECE contributed to the work of the E15 Initiative – a joint initiative of the International Centre for Trade and Sustainable Development (ICTSD) and the World Economic Forum (WEF) – and in particular the Task Force on “Regulatory Coherence”.

B. Partnerships with regional organizations

14. The European Commission (EC) participated in WP.6 meetings, and contributed to ECE work on equipment used in environments with an explosive atmosphere. The Commission also participated in the ECE activities in support of market surveillance and inspections.

15. The International Model on Regulatory Harmonization, as contained in the UNECE WP.6 Recommendation L, was used extensively by the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) Interstate Council for Standardization, Metrology and Certification (EASC).

C. Cooperation with standard setting and quality infrastructure organizations

(a) Standardization policies

16. ECE participated at the ISO Annual Session of 2017 and worked with the World Standards Cooperation (WSC), which supports high-level collaboration between the IEC, the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU).

17. A number of standardization organizations take part in the Annual Session of WP.6, including among others, the American National Standards Institute (ANSI), American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), European Committee for Standardization (CEN), European Committee for Electrotechnical Standardization (CENELEC), Global Standards One (GS1), International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC), ISO, International Social and Environmental Accreditation and Labelling Alliance (ISEAL), ITU and World Wildlife Fund (WWF).

18. WP.6 sectoral initiative on “equipment used in environments with an explosive atmosphere” benefits from partnerships with IEC and its System for Certification to Standards Relating to Equipment for Use in Explosive Atmosphere (IECEX) with the

support of the German government through the Physikalisch-Technische Bundesanstalt (PTB). A UNECE-IECEX Workshop took place in April 2017 in Shanghai, China and an International Conference of IECEX in cooperation with UNECE will take place in April 2018 in Split, Croatia.

19. The WP.6 Group of Experts on Risk Management in Regulatory Systems (GRM) is also built on a partnership with standard-setting bodies, in particular, with the ISO Technical Committee (TC) 262 on Risk Management.

20. IEC and ISO are also close partners for the Working Party's activities in the area of conformity assessment, specifically, through the IEC Conformity Assessment Board, the IEC Conformity Assessment Systems and the ISO Committee on Conformity Assessment (ISO/CASCO). In addition, WP.6 is a member of the Strategic Alliance and Regulatory Group (STAR), which provides strategic advice to the CASCO Committee of ISO. A new sectoral initiative on cybersecurity was approved at the 27th Plenary Session of WP.6 in cooperation with IEC in November 2017.

(b) Metrology and other areas of the national and international system of quality infrastructure

21. WP.6 works in partnership with national, regional and international institutions including: the Bureau International des Poids et Mesures (BIPM), International Committee of Weights and Measures (CIPM), International Accreditation Forum (IAF), International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC), International Laboratory Accreditation Co-operation (ILAC), International Organization of Legal Metrology (OIML), International Committee for Legal Metrology (CIML), ISO, ITU and the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO).

22. Since 2010, the Working Party has been a member of the "International Network on Quality Infrastructure" (previously Network on Metrology, Accreditation and Standardization for Developing Countries (DCMAS)), which includes: BIPM, CIPM, International Accreditation Forum (IAF), IEC, ILAC, OIML, International Committee for Legal Metrology (CIML), ISO, ITU and UNIDO.

IV. Trade Facilitation

23. ECE is part of the United Nations Inter-Agency cluster on Trade and Productive Capacity. The cluster, which is led by the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), was established in 2007 to create synergies between productive capacity-building and trade development under the United Nations "Delivering as One" initiative.

24. ECE also participates in the Joint United Nations Regional Commissions (UNRCs) Approach on Trade Facilitation, launched in January 2010 by the five UN Regional Commissions. In 2017, the ECE and its sister regional commissions launched the second Global Survey conducted, which covered 120 countries. The results were presented at UNRCs joint events during the World Trade Organization (WTO) Aid for Trade Global Review, held in Geneva (July 2017), and the 11th WTO Ministerial in Buenos Aires, Argentina (December 2017).

25. As a member of the Global Facilitation Partnership for Transportation and Trade (GFP)² ECE contributed to the organisation of GFP Steering Committee meeting, held in Geneva, Switzerland on 19-20 January 2017.
26. In 2017, ECE joined UNCTAD's multi-stakeholder initiative "eTrade for All", which now brings together 22 international organizations to support the developing countries trade development efforts. Events in 2017 include the "E-Commerce and Trade Logistics: New Challenges, Opportunities and Solutions for International Transport and Trade Facilitation" that was jointly organized with UNCTAD, the International Trade Centre (ITC) and the World Customs Organization (WCO).
27. ECE remains dedicated to assist member states with their obligations under the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement. During 2017, ECE supported UNCTAD Empowerment Programme for National Trade Facilitation Committees (NTFCs) in Cameroon, Gabon and Benin (May and August 2017).
28. ECE has also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Asia Pacific Council for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business (AFACT) in April 2017. It is currently working on a joint project with ITC and the European Commission's Directorate-General for International Cooperation and Development (DG DEVCO) to develop a traceability framework in the garment sector.
29. ECE has been cooperating with several European Commission Directorate Generals (DGs) over the past years. In 2017, ECE participated in the Directorate-General for Mobility and Transport (DG-MOVE) Digital Transport and Logistics Forum (DTLF) sub-group workshops, which looked into the documentary requirements in transport and logistics and their dematerialization. DG-MOVE was invited to present their work at the fourth UNECE Single Window Conference. Moreover, the Directorate-General for Maritime Affairs and Fisheries (DG-MARE) has been actively engaging with the work of the ECE Team of Specialists on Sustainable Fisheries.
30. ECE cooperated with the Eurasian Economic Commission (EEC) and organized several joint events such as the conference on Single Window implementation in Moscow in December 2017, and a series of workshops for training trade agencies on supply chain management, simplification of import and exports procedures.
31. The Parties to the Electronic Business Memorandum of Understanding (ebMoU) signed between the UNECE, the International Standards Organization (ISO), the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) and the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) Committee have met in November 2017, December 2017 and January 2018.
32. ECE supported ISO Technical Committees (TCs) Category-A liaisons, including ISO TC 154 (Processes, data elements and documents in commerce, industry and administration), ISO TC 204 (Intelligent Transport Systems), ISO TC 307 (Blockchain) and ISO TC 308 (Chain of Custody). This completes the Category-A liaison already established with ISO PC 295 (Audit data collection) and the Category-B liaison with ISO TC 68 (Financial services). ECE also worked with ISO TC 154 on UN/EDIFACT syntax and the United Nations Trade Data Element Dictionary (UNTDDED).
