- 2. Under this item, the secretariat will report on matters arising from the 2017 meetings of the Economic Commission for Europe Executive Committee (EXCOM) and the Secretary General reforms for repositioning the United Nations development system to deliver on the 2030 Agenda (A/72/124-E/2018/3).

#### **Item 3. Improving the Steering Committee on Trade Capacity and Standards delivery on the 2030 Agenda.**

- 3. During the third session of the Economic Commission for Europe Steering Committee on Trade Capacity and Standards (SCTCS), member States requested the secretariat to report on progress made in extending the scope of the evaluation methodology

used in its studies on regulatory and procedural barrier to trade to capture the impact of non-tariff measures on the achievement of sustainable development goals (SCTCS Decision 2017-4.2b contained in ECE/CTCS/2017/2).

4. To ensure prompt responsiveness and proper addressing of the cross-cutting nature of sustainable development goals, the Chair of the SCTCS decided to review the activities under the Steering Committee in terms of their consistency with the level of ambition of the 2030 Agenda (A/RES/70/1).

5. Delegates are invited to discuss the results of the review (ECE/CTCS/2018/3) and the terms of reference of the SCTCS (ECE/CTCS/2018/4), which were prepared by the Chair with the support of the Secretariat following consultations with the Bureau members.

## **B. High-level segment: Removing regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in the Economic Commission for Europe region**

### **Item 4. Supporting the removal of regulatory and procedural barriers to trade**

#### **(a) Georgia: Findings and recommendations**

6. Delegates will be briefed about the findings and recommendations emerging from the ECE study of regulatory and procedural barriers to trade in Georgia. The study was conducted in 2017 using the ECE evaluation methodology, which was extended to capture the impact of non-tariff measures on the achievement of SDGs.

7. The study captures both behind and at-the-border regulatory and procedural barriers to trade, highlights their impact on transaction costs (in terms of both time and money). It also highlights the implication of these barriers for the achievement of SDGs and provides detailed recommendations.

8. Delegates will be also invited to discuss areas for possible joint action and coordination with development partners.
