Electronic certification is a structured representation of the information contained in the certificate, using international standards which allow information exchange through electronic means.



Electronic certification replaces printed paper sendings with data in XML format in a system vs. system and Government-to-Government scheme, where the destination country official can review the data of a certificate directly in the import operation.

What do other countries require for electronic certification with México?

- Must have an electronic Certificate issuance system established nationwide to issue Export certificates.
- The country, according to the WORLD TRADE ORGANIZATION, has to establish a Single Window for foreign trade.
- Both countries must have an interoperability mechanism or system for sending and receiving XML messages with integrated security.



- A national import system that allows receiving XML from other countries and that can display data of the transmitted certificates to officials.
- The emission system has to be adjusted to the international standard (UNCEFACT).

- Mexico is using the Mexican Digital Window for Foreign Trade, as established by the World Trade Organization, for electronic certification.
- Mexico's analysis and transformation of data from phytosanitary certificates work according to the international UNCEFACT standard.
- Mexican officers at entry points can review electronic Certificates received from other countries.
- There must be bilaterality and reciprocity in electronic certification; in the same way that Mexico will receive the electronic Certificates, the countries must accept the Certificates issued by Mexico under the same conditions.
- An agreement, protocol, memorandum, work plan, or other equivalent instruments must be concluded, with which the electronic exchange of information will take place.



Since September 28th, Mexico exchanges International Phytosanitary Certificates (CFI) with Chile, Colombia, and Peru, members of the Pacific Alliance. The CFI is sent simultaneously on paper along with the electronic certificate format.

The issuance of the CFI is encouraged through the Single Window (VU), a training program has been implemented for Officers, users and service providers.

Beginning of the “paperless” between the 4 countries of the Pacific Alliance from August 1, 2019.
