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


Organizational Structure






Process of developing a UNECE standard

UNECE Specialized Section on Standardization of FFV Summary of decisions

- Revised the text of the <u>Standard Layout</u> of the Standards for FFV and recommended that the Working Party on Agricultural Quality Standards adopt it for a trial period of one year.
 - Amendments concerning the point of application and provisions on tolerances and marking.
 - To facilitate uniform interpretation of standards and to prevent subjective terms such as "slight defects" becoming trade barriers, it was proposed to amend the Standard Layout with a table on maximum allowances for defects. Delegations decided not to include it in the Standard Layout.
 - The Section decided to delete the sentence "The [*produce*] must be carefully picked" from all standards.
 - Use of Code Marks: The labelling requirements for code marks have been amended to avoid the use of only code marks without the information required in the Standard Layout. This would make easier tracing the supplier and to comply with food safety requirements.

• Amended texts on <u>Cherries</u>, <u>Table Grapes</u>, <u>Ceps</u> and <u>Apples</u> for approval as revised/new UNECE standards.



UNECE Specialized Section on Standardization of FFV Summary of decisions

 Adopted revised texts on <u>Apricots</u>, <u>Cucumbers</u> and <u>Peaches and Nectarines</u> as recommendations for trial use until the end of 2008.



• Early and Ware Potatoes:

The delegation of France proposed to include two quality classes of potatoes in the Standard, reword provisions concerning minimum requirements and quality tolerances, and amend the text with two annexes describing the defects allowed in Class I and Class II for ware potatoes and for early potatoes.

The Specialized Section decided to revisit the issue of introducing quality classes in the Standard at its 2008 meeting.



• The UNECE cooperation task force and the OECD exploratory task force met jointly during the meeting to advance work on concentrating activities in agricultural quality standards within UNECE.
