1. Adoption of the agenda

2. Matters arising since the last session

(a) United Nations, United Nations Economic Commission for Europe and subsidiary bodies

The secretariat will present recent matters arising from the United Nations, the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE), the Steering Committee on Trade Capacity and Standards and the Working Party on Agricultural Quality Standards (WP.7) having an impact on the work of the Specialized Section.

(b) Recent developments in other organizations

Representatives of other organizations and country delegations will inform the Specialized Section about activities taking place in their agencies that are of relevance to the work of the Section.

As they agreed at the 2017 session of the Working Party, delegations are invited to discuss the activities by the Codex Alimentarius Commission of relevance to the Specialized Section.

3. Revision of standards

(a) Citrus fruit

At its 2017 session, the Specialized Section decided to initiate a full review of the standard and to consider proposals, comments and submissions from the 2016 and 2017 sessions. The reflection of 2016 that the integrity of the citrus fruit standard could be kept, while separate annexes for each species could simplify its use could provide the basis for this revision. The Specialized Section is invited to review the revised draft standard prepared by the Rapporteur (South Africa), which incorporates the comments received in 2016 and 2017, as well as proposals to align with the Codex provisions substantively deviating from the UNECE provisions.

(b) Cherries

At its 2017 session, the Specialized Section decided to discuss the comments by the delegation from Belgium on the minimum size for cherries.

(c) Ware potatoes

At its 2016 session, the Specialized Section had accepted the proposal by India to compare the proposed new Codex draft standard with the existing UNECE Standard for Early and Ware Potatoes. The following document presents a comparison between the Codex draft standard (currently at step 5) and the UNECE standard,

(d) Table grapes – List of varieties

(e) Peaches and nectarines

The Specialized Section is invited to review the proposal by the United States to revise the sizing provisions in the Standard for Peaches and Nectarines.

(f) Fresh figs

The Rapporteur (Brazil) will provide an update on new developments concerning how to handle white coating on fresh figs and the minimum requirement “clean”.

(g) Other standards

Depending on the requests for revisions from delegations, the Specialized Section may wish to consider other standards as well as possible items that impact on UNECE work because of decisions taken by the 2017 Codex Committee on Fresh Fruits and Vegetables.

4. Standard Layout for United Nations Economic Commission for Europe Standards for Fresh Fruit and Vegetables

At its 2017 session, the Specialized Section decided to continue the discussion on a possible simplification of the section on tolerances and their application. To provide background for the review of that section, the delegation from the United States will give a detailed presentation on the topic and the delegation from Germany will explain how the OECD inspection guidelines provide guidance on how to determine the tolerances through e.g. photos.

Moreover, the Specialized Section is invited to consider the addition of the indication of the importer or seller in the Identification section of the provisions concerning marking (section VI.A). Identification, as well as items that might impact on UNECE work because of decisions taken by the Codex Committee on Fresh Fruits and Vegetables in October 2017.

5. Sustainable Development Goal 12 and sustainable practices: Food loss related to the use of standards

At its 2017 session, the Specialized Section decided to initiate work on draft baseline quality requirements. The delegations from Germany will present a first draft for review and discussion by the Specialized Section.

The Specialized Section had also started working on a Code of Good Practice to help guide and ensure quality along the marketing and supply chain. The delegation from Sweden - as leader of the working group - will present a first draft for review.

6. Code mark registry

The secretariat will provide an update on the UNECE code mark registry established at the beginning of 2018 after adoption by the November 2017 Working Party session

7. Electronic quality certificates for fresh fruit and vegetables

The secretariat will inform the Specialized Section on progress made in the area of electronic quality certificates and the collaboration with the relevant group of the United Nations Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business (UN/CEFACT) which had been approached at the September 2017 CEFACT Forum in Rome, Italy.

8. Promotion and capacity-building

Delegations and the secretariat will provide information about their promotional and capacity-building activities and preview planned new events and training.

9. Other business

Any other issues of interest for the work of the Specialized Section can be discussed under this agenda item.

10. Future work

The Specialized Section will discuss its future work.

11. Election of officers

The Specialized Section will elect a Chair and Vice-Chair. At its sixty-fifth session, it elected Ms. Ulrike Bickelmann (Germany) as Chair and Ms. Kristina Mattsson (Sweden) as Vice-Chair.

12. Adoption of the report

The Specialized Section will adopt the report of the session.
