

## DEFINITION & CLASSIFICATION



The UNECE standard applies to whole figs dried from ripe fruits of varieties (cultivars) grown from *Ficus carica* L., intended for direct consumption. It does not apply to dried figs for industrial processing.

Dried figs are classified into the following **three classes: Extra Class, Class I and Class II.**

The classification is determined in accordance with the defects allowed in the Standard's section "IV, Provisions concerning tolerances".
