1. Adoption of the agenda

In accordance with Chapter III, Rule 7 of the Rules of Procedure (TRANS/WP.29/690 and Amend.1) of the World Forum for Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations (WP.29), the first item on the provisional agenda is the adoption of the agenda (ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/2010/6).

2. Heavy duty vehicle engines

2.1. Worldwide harmonized Heavy Duty Certification procedure (WHDC)

GRPE may wish to be briefed about the status of establishing Amendment 2 to gtr No. 4 on WHDC in the Global Registry as well as the corresponding proposal to align with the provisions of Regulation No. 49 (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 5-7).

2.2. Worldwide harmonized Heavy duty On-Board Diagnostic systems (WWH-OBD)

GRPE is expected to consider a proposal to align the provisions of gtr No. 5 on WWH-OBD with the new Euro VI emission requirements for heavy duty vehicle engines, if available (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 8-9).

2.3. Heavy Duty Hybrid Electric Vehicles (HD-HEV)

GRPE may wish to consider a proposal for the terms of reference and rules of procedures for the new working group on HD-HEV, if available (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 12-13).

2.4. Retrofit Emissions Control devices (REC)

GRPE agreed to consider a proposal for the terms of reference and rules of procedures for the new working group on REC (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 47-49).

2.5. Regulation No. 49 (Emissions of C.I. and P.I. (NG and CNG) engines)

GRPE may wish to examine a proposal to amend Regulation No. 49, if available (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 10-11).

3. Particle Measurement Programme (PMP)

GRPE agreed to consider proposals to amend Regulations Nos. 49 and 83 with regard to the particle number measurement method (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 14-16).

4. Worldwide harmonized Motorcycle emission Test Cycle (WMTC)

GRPE agreed to have a final review of a proposal by Germany regarding the insertion of emission limit values into gtr No. 2 on WMTC (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 17-19).

5. Engines of tractors and Non-Road Mobile Machinery (NRMM)

GRPE may wish to be informed about the status of transposing gtr No. 11 on NRMM into national or regional legislations (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, para. 20).

5.1. Regulation No. 120 (Internal combustion engines for tractors)

GRPE agreed to examine a proposal to align the provisions of Regulation No. 120 with those of Regulation No. 96, if available (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, para. 35).

6. Light vehicle engines

6.1. Worldwide harmonized Light vehicles Test Procedures (WLTP)

GRPE may wish to receive information by the Chair of the informal group about the progress made by the WLTP subgroups during their meetings held prior to the GRPE session proper (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 21-25).

6.2. Gaseous-Fuelled Vehicles (GFV)

GRPE may wish to be briefed by the Chair of the GFV working group about the results of the meetings held prior to the GRPE session proper (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 26-27).

6.3. Regulation No. 83 (Emissions of M₁ and N₁ categories of vehicles)

GRPE agreed to have a detailed consideration of a proposal to update in Regulation No. 83 the specifications for the proportional speed fan which might be used during the testing of vehicles on the chassis dynamometer. GRPE also agreed to resume consideration of a proposal tabled by the Russian Federation to amend Regulation No. 83 regard to the Euro 4 emission levels (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/GRPE/59, paras. 28-31).

10. Consolidated Resolution on the Construction of Vehicles (R.E.3)

The World Forum WP.29 agreed, at its March 2010 session, to refer a proposal for amendments to the Consolidated Resolution R.E.3 to its subsidiary bodies for a detailed consideration and requested the Chairpersons to report back to WP.29 by March 2011 (see ECE/TRANS/WP.29/1083, para. 74).
