II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

Item 1. Adoption of the agenda

1. The Working Party will adopt the agenda of its fourth session.

Item 2. Election of officers

2. The term of office of Bureau members elected at the second session in 2018 comes to an end at the forthcoming session. If they would like to continue in their role for a further two-year term, they need to be re-elected. Delegates may elect additional officers nominated by Governments to the Bureau of the Working Party on Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) for a term of office of two years.

Item 3. Policy discussion: Mainstreaming the People-first Public-Private Partnerships model

3. Under this agenda item, member States will have the opportunity to discuss current work and their objectives in mainstreaming the People-first Public-Private Partnerships model. The discussion will be structured in separate policy panels as follows:

A. The role of the Evaluation Methodology in scoring and evaluating People-first PPPs

(a) How can the Evaluation Methodology contribute to advancing the SDGs and achieving more high-quality infrastructure projects?

(b) How can the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and SIF-SOURCE³ work together in rolling-out the self-assessment component of the Evaluation Methodology?

(c) How can the Evaluation Methodology be scaled-up to maximise its impact? Can for example the other Regional Commissions and the Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UN DESA) play a role in its dissemination? Is there a way to use the Methodology for rating projects more than one at a time?

B. Special session on the Guidelines on People-first PPP Waste-to-Energy projects and the circular economy

Given the interest of member States for UNECE subsidiary bodies to contribute to the high-level theme of the forthcoming sixty-ninth Commission session in April 2021 in promoting circular economy and sustainable use of natural resources in the UNECE region, it is proposed to hold a special session on the role of People-first PPPs in advancing the transition

to a circular economy. The session will also discuss the Guidelines on People-first PPP Waste-to-Energy projects and the circular economy.

(a) At first sight, the Waste-to-Energy industry appears fully compatible with the circular economy: but, is it compatible?

(b) What should governments, cities, and other authorities do to advance the circular economy principles in different People-first PPP infrastructure projects, including Waste-to-Energy?

(c) How sharing of experiences in good-practice countries, as referred to in the Guidelines, and in their respective ways, improved waste management policies through adopting People-first PPP best practices?

4. The detailed programme of the policy discussion will be developed in consultation with the Bureau and will be made available to participants on the UNECE's website.⁴

5. The Working Party will review the PPP work since its last session in December 2019 on:

(a) Policy documents: International Public-Private Partnerships Standards, Guidelines, Guiding Principles, Declarations, and Recommendations;

(b) Implementation: capacity-building activities and policy advisory services.

A. Policy documents: International Public-Private Partnerships Standards, Guidelines, Guiding Principles, Declarations, and Recommendations

6. The following documents are being presented for consideration and endorsement of the Working Party.

The Working Party will decide on whether to endorse the following documents:

(a) Draft People-first PPP Evaluation Methodology for the SDGs; and

(b) Guidelines on promoting People-first PPP Waste-to-Energy Projects for the Circular Economy;

7. The Working Party will receive a progress report by the secretariat on the draft standards and best practice guides at various stages of preparation:

B. Implementation: capacity-building activities and policy advisory services

8. The Working Party will review the capacity-building activities and the policy advisory services undertaken since the last session. The Working Party will also review the activities undertaken by the Specialist Centres of Excellence, including information on their coordination meeting in New Orleans and the virtual meetings held since the last session.

9. The members of the Working Party will have the opportunity to take stock of past PPP activities and discuss effective means for the promotion and dissemination of this work.

10. The members of the Working Party will have the opportunity to share experience on how the People-first PPP approach can help society to better cope with the COVID-19 pandemic and to building back better. Under the auspices of the Specialist Centres of Excellence affiliated to the UNECE, Guidelines on Resilience People-first PPP in the context of COVID-19 are being produced for the benefit and use by member States.

12. The Working Party will have the opportunity to hear proposals for new standards to be developed where the Working Party has a mandate on Sustainable Development Goals' related areas.⁵ New proposals are subject to interest by experts participating in project teams and resources.

13. Participants are encouraged to communicate to the meeting any expressions of interest by member States or other stakeholders for receiving, delivering, or hosting capacity-building activities in the priority areas of the Working Party's work. Requests from member States for capacity-building activities and policy advisory services will be considered based on available capacity and extrabudgetary resources.

14. Participants are also encouraged to bring to the attention of the session any expression of interest by member States and other stakeholders to provide extrabudgetary support towards the UNECE People-first PPP work (such as funds or in-kind contributions, including the organization of seminars and networking initiatives).
