1 Given UNECE's convening power and mandate, UNECE can facilitate involving and engaging with a broader range of key stakeholders/decision makers that could advance the Air Convention priorities more effectively by: - organizing regional or national seminars to include decision-makers, such as representatives of the ministries of environment and natural resource management; - including officials from statistical agencies in trainings would also facilitate their understanding of the type of data required to apply international methodologies.	UNECE partially accepts the recommendation. UNECE will continue to organize regional and national seminars to include decision-makers under the complementary projects under the workplan for the Convention (e.g. project co-funded by the European Union (Support to the implementation of the Convention on Long-Range Transboundary Air Pollution in the EECCA region" (2014–2018) and "Implementation of the UNECE Convention on Long-Range Transboundary Air Pollution (CLRTAP) – Phase II" (2019-2021)). As regards the inclusion of officials from statistical agencies in trainings, UNECE has limited influence on the nominations of national experts for trainings but will recommend participation of officials from statistical agencies. The Air Unit/Environment Division (Krzysztof Olendrzynski, Environmental Affairs Officer) will ensure that complementary actions, such as seminars including decision-makers, will be organized, e.g. in the	Convention on long-range transboundary air pollution Secretariat	December 2021	In Progress A sub-regional workshop on promoting the ratification of protocols and the application of best available techniques (BATs) in the EECCA region was organized by the Convention's Task Force on Techno-Economic Issues (TFTEI) in close collaboration with the secretariat on 14 -16 May 2019 in Berlin, Germany. The workshop improved understanding of EECCA experts (19 experts (11 of them female) from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Ukraine and Uzbekistan) on the concept of BATs and enhanced exchange of experiences among countries. Participants identified further steps and needs to facilitate the application of BAT, e.g., the need to provide assistance and advice to EECCA experts in estimating and measuring VOC emissions. (Funded by EU project "Implementation of the UNECE Convention on Long-Range Transboundary Air Pollution (CLRTAP) — Phase II" (2019-2021)) Therefore, follow up workshop on assessment and measurement of emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOC) from installations (requirements, emission monitoring, BATs) was organised on 11-12 November 2019 in Minsk, Belarus. The workshop provided clear examples of methods and applications to correctly approach the issue of VOC, in line with the Gothenburg Protocol provisions. The workshop was attended by technical experts from Belarus, Georgia,

					A five-day workshop was organized for national experts in Azerbaijan (23-27 September 2019) and Armenia (21-25 October 2019) to improve and maintain the completeness and accuracy of national air pollutant emission inventories under the Air Convention. The workshop, held in Baku, brought together six national experts (including five female experts) from the Ministry of Environment of Azerbaijan, responsible for developing a national inventory of air pollutant emissions. The Armenian Inventory Group was represented by seven national experts (all female) from the Environmental Monitoring and Information Center of the Ministry of Environment. The workshops resulted in improved skills of national experts in the preparation of national reporting (Annex I – Emissions reporting, Annex V - Gridded Emissions and, and the Information Inventory Report (IIR) – Annex II).
					In May 2020, UNECE organized an online meeting of the EECCA Coordinating Group to engage representatives of Ministries and share progress on ratification and implementation of the Convention.
					As regards the inclusion of officials from statistical agencies in trainings, UNECE has limited impact on the nomination of national experts to participate in the training sessions, but the secretariat nevertheless recommended the participation of statistical officials

2	UNECE in collaboration with committed and experienced national partners should further work on the adaptability of the tools and methodologies to the regional and national contexts. Furthermore, UNECE may consider diversifying the portfolio of products covered in subsequent workshops and seminars, to include Greenhouse Gas - Air Pollution Interactions and Synergies (GAINS), COPERT and the like.	UNECE partially accepts this recommendation. To complement activities under the capacity-building programme under the Convention, UNECE organized a workshop on GAINS in 2018. As there was a lot of interest, UNECE will try to organize further workshops on models such as GAINS and COPERT used under the Convention, depending on availability of resources. The workshop in 2018 has also helped in adapting the GAINS model further to suit national and regional contexts. In addition, UNECE has already engaged in translating information, analysis, and legislative texts into Russian and national languages. The Air Unit/Environment Division (Krzysztof Olendrzynski, Environmental Affairs Officer) will try to continue complementary activities on the tools and models (GAINS, COPERT) under the Convention, depending on availability of resources, by the end of 2021. Sufficient attention and resources should be put to cover expenditures for staff needed to manage and implement the project throughout its cycle.	UNECE accepts this recommendation. As resources for staff often do not suffice to implement the full project and therefore need to be complemented by other funding sources, UNECE will assess and scrutinize the needs for expenditures for staff more thoroughly and establish thresholds, below which a project manager cannot be hired. The Air Unit/Environment Division (Krzysztof Olendrzynski, Environmental Affairs Officer) will more clearly communicate to donors the need for staff resources for future projects.
