Concept Note

The Issue-based Coalition on Sustainable Food Systems is organizing a series of webinars aiming to build the capacities of the UN Country Teams in the region on sustainable food systems and to facilitate the sharing of best practices, knowledge and tools from within and outside of the region, to support the COVID-19 response.

The first webinar aims at setting the scene by providing the participants with a common understanding on what a food systems approach is, showing its multiple dimensions, and why it is important. It will offer an opportunity to share available tools and resources on the food systems in the context of COVID-19 with a focus on food security, nutrition and health.

Key questions to be addressed at the webinar:

- 1. What are the important concepts and elements of a sustainable food systems approach?
- 2. What are the relevant tools and resources on the food systems which can support UNCTs in the region to better respond to COVID-19 impact on food security, nutrition and health?

This first webinar will be followed by two more webinars that will focus on specific aspects of the food systems that are of relevance and priority for the region.
