Collaboration agreement between UNECE and UN-GGIM: Europe (2021-2023)

I. Summary

 This agreement is an updated version of the first collaboration agreement between UNECE and UN-GGIM: Europe, which covered the period 2018 to 2020. That agreement was endorsed by the 2017 plenary sessions of UN-GGIM: Europe and the Conference of European Statisticians, as well as the UNECE Executive Committee at its 95th Meeting (EXCOM/CONCLU/95).

Long-standing efforts in modernization enabled NSOs to quickly adapt to new conditions and demands. Guidelines on Risk Management received record views during the pandemic.
