Status report to 73rd GRBP (January 2021)

Introduction

 Following the 71st session of GRBP the Task Force was created with the aim to introduce harmonised measures on Tyre Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) and on Tyre Installation for all M-, N- and O-categories of vehicles to UN Regulation No. 141 and to No. 142, in order to increase vehicles safety and their environmental performance.

Objectives

- The Task Force shall develop and propose requirements for Tyre
 Pressure Monitoring System (TPMS) and for Tyre Installation concerning
 all M-, N- and O-categories of vehicles.
- The scope and purpose of the Task Force should cover UN Regulation No. 141 and No. 142.
- The Task Force shall, where appropriate, develop amendments to these two Regulations or develop new Regulations for N₂, N₃, M₂, M₃, O₃ and O₄.
- The Task Force shall report to GRBP.

Timeline

- The 72nd GRBP adopted a working document and an informal document with amendments to each of UN R141 (TPMS) and UN R142 (tyre installation).
 - Informal documents necessary to complete the TF work delayed by the Covid-19 restrictions.
- Work is continuing on detailed technical matters.

 - Between 40 and 50 experts joined in average the meetings on UN R No. 141

- Small sub-group meeting on Warming-up procedure in August 2020
- Experts group on TPMS communication interface N-O vehicles

- 9th and 10th meeting on TPMS in November 2020
- 11th and 12th meeting on TPMS in December 2020
- Until the 8th meeting, TF assisted by TRL through a study on TPMS testing requirements

Status of the work on UN Regulation No. 142

• The Task Force finished the work on the amendments to UN Regulation No. 142 at its 8th meeting.

Status of the work on UN Regulation No. 141

- The Task Force finished the work on nearly all amendments to UN Regulation No. 141 at its 8th meeting and presented a working document and an informal document to the 72nd GRBP.
 - Transitional provisions aligned in UN R141 and 142 with the corresponding ones in Regulation (EU) 2019/2144 (GSR)
- Based on the work of the Experts group on TPMS communication interface of N-O vehicles the 9th Task Force meeting resulted in a working document to the 73rd GRBP addressing the requirements for the "Communication Interface" between the towing vehicle and the to be towed vehicle(s) of category O₃ and O₄.
 - Paragraph 5.6. has been updated and Annexes 5 and 6 drafted.
- The 10th 12th Task Force meetings continued the work on the "Communication interface" and submitted an informal document to the 73rd GRBP.

Timeline Schedule

- One issue is still open and needs further work to be finalized: the TPMS/TPRS/CTIS "Communication interface" of N category vehicles with in service O₃ and O₄ category vehicles not equipped with TPMS.
- Work to continue on the open issue after the 73rd GRBP
 - Preliminary date for the 13th Task Force meeting: 23 February 2021
 - Work to be based on the documents
