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

THE NEW LEIPZIG CHARTER



For strong urban governance to assure the common good cities need:

- Legal framework conditions
- · Investment capacities
- · Adequately skilled employees
- Access to and steerability of infrastructure, public services/welfare

For strong urban governance to assure the common good cities need:

- Active and strategic land policy and land use planning
- Active shaping of the digital transformation

Adequate Policies and funding for cities:

- Powerful national urban policy framework and funding
- Coherent EU regulations and funding instruments




The Transformative Power of **European Cities**

updated three-columned model of sustainability

= three basic dimensions ofEuropean cities

Digitalisation as cross-cutting issue





Just

- Ensure equal opportunities for all, equal access to public services;
- Adequate, accessible, safe and affordable housing;
- Socially balanced, mixed and safe neighbourhoods

Green

- Creation of high-quality urban environment (air, water, soil), biodiversity;
- Climate neutral energy supply and energy efficiency;
- Shift towards sustainable mobility

Productive

- Productive, innovative & competitive city with traditional & new industries/crafts;
- Shift towards digital, service-oriented and low-carbon economy;
- Promoting mix of living, working, recreation, education, leisure



Key principles of good urban governance

- Urban policy for the common good:
 - Providing services and infrastructure for the common good, including housing
- Integrated approach
- Participation and Co-Creation
- Multi-level governance
- Place-based approach



Empowering Cities to Transform

Cities need support from European, national and regional level to be capable to respond to current and future challenges.

Cities therefore need ...

... legal framework conditions in a multi-level governance system

....adequate investment capacities (own income, allocations)

... appropriately skilled, qualified and trained employees

... steerability and shaping of infrastructure, public services/welfare



Empowering Cities to Transform

Powerful national policy framework and funding

Appeal to Member States to support active and strategic land policy, including:

 "Sufficient areas for adequate, safe, well-designed and affordable housing to ensure vibrant and socially mixed neighbourhoods, avoiding speculative land policy"



Empowering Cities to Transform

Coherent EU regulation and funding instruments

- Continuation of the Urban Agenda for the EU as implementing process for:
 better regulation, better funding and better knowledge
- Keep the urban dimension in Cohesion Policy
- Stimulate integrated, innovative and participatory approaches in sustainable urban development, supported via European Urban Initiative
- Better coordination of vertical and horizontal exchange of knowledge and expertise
