EU Youth Strategy a policy cooperation frame for all relevant stakeholders

EU institutions & other international organisations, member states, local & regional authorities, youth organisations & organisations working with young people, youth workers, youth researchers, civil society actors





Supporting youth empowerment through quality, innovation and recognition of youth work Fostering young people's participation in civic and democratic life









EU Youth Dialogue – youth empowerment via influencing policy choices

- Cca 50 000 participants in each 18-month cycle-one of the biggest citizens' participation mechanism the EU in any policy area
- Consultation phase young people from diverse backgrounds involved - launch of a Europe-wide online survey in mid-March
- Deliberative democracy in practice-highlights are the EU Youth Conferences, decision makers and youth representatives together. Last one in Berlin 2-5 October, next one in Portugal in 12-15 March
- Current Trio Presidency (Germany-Portugal-Slovenia) has the overarching theme for this 8th cycle "Europe for YOUth-YOUth for Europe. Space and Democracy and Participation"
- European Youth Goals
 - Window of opportunity to influence EU's youth policy
 - Ensuring that youth policy is (remains) cross-sectoral
 - Building the basis for a strategical approach towards challenges of young people in Europe



Youth employment support in Covid-19 times

- 18% of young people in EU are jobless recovery is about its next generation
- Youth Employment Support (YES) package adopted in July with several initiative - provide 22 billion EUR on youth employment measures given the unprecedented EU funding availabilities
- The Youth Guarantee already helped 24 million young people find a job, continued education, training or apprenticeship since 2013
- National schemes employment offer, education, traineeship or apprentice-ship within 4 months of being unemployed/leaving formal education.
- Reinforced Youth Guarantee to support more young people in school-to-work and early job-to-job transitions by opening it up to the age of 29 years.
- Steps up the outreach to vulnerable and marginalised young people



Digital Education Action Plan (2021-2027) future of digital education in a lifelong perspective

Two key objectives:

- 1. Boosting the digital readiness of education and training systems planned approach: robust infrastructure, leadership and vision, high quality digital resources and skilled teachers
- 2. Digital skills and competences for the digital transformation from an early age being digitally competent is a necessity and a right responsible and safe use of digital technologies through improving digital literacy skills, developing critical thinking, and raising awareness of individual rights and obligations
- Developing digital skills, including digital literacy skills crucial that young people can feel empowered, connected but also safe when communicating online
