2	UNECE should carefully plan the adoption of the innovation and competitiveness principles by the member States (governments and private sector). By increasing capacities of policy makers and popularizing "people-first "principles in PPPs, UNECE plays the "facilitator" role between the public and the private sector in the region and creates the premises for a sustainable economic and social development. The operationalization of the principles should be further guided by UNECE, in consultation with the member States.	UNECE has a mandate to adopt innovation and competitiveness principles and has been operationalizing "people-first" PPP principles. UNECE also has been increasing the capacities of policy makers in this area and has played the role of facilitator between the public and private sectors and will continue to do so. UNECE will create a task force on innovation and competitiveness principles at the 2019 annual session of the Team of Specialists on Innovation and Competitiveness Policies (December 2019). UNECE will continue to guide the operationalization of people-first PPP principles in consultation with member States.
