				Delegates noted that such projects contributed to knowledge- and experience-sharing, for the benefit of harmonizing national procedures and strengthening transboundary cooperation and highlighted that the Assistance and Cooperation Programme was an important means for enhancing industrial safety in the Central Asian subregion. A representative of the Russian Federation also acknowledged that the work under the Project allowed CAC to strengthen industrial safety and the Convention's Chair acknowledged CAC's successes in the Project implementation. COP-11 welcomed the achievements of the CAC under the Project, as evidenced by the independent external evaluation and positively noted the continuation of support to these countries, to address existing gaps and challenges.
