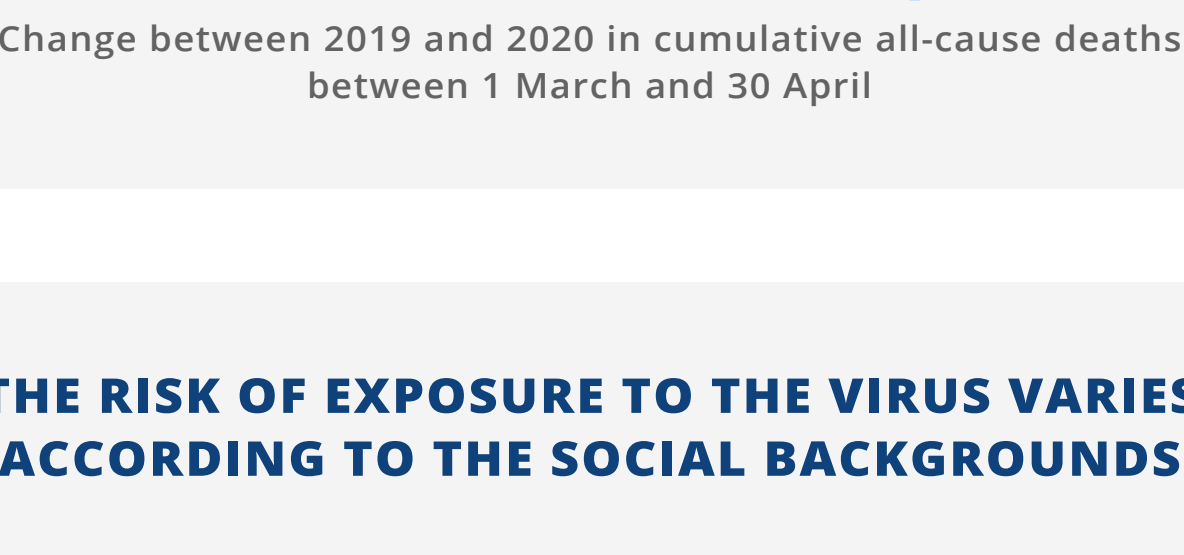


MORTALITY INCREASED SIGNIFICANTLY IN MARCH/APRIL 2020, BUT NOT EQUALLY ACROSS ALL REGIONS



Change between 2019 and 2020 in cumulative all-cause deaths between 1 March and 30 April

THE INCREASE IN MORTALITY PARTICULARLY AFFECTED THE ELDEST AND PEOPLE BORN ABROAD

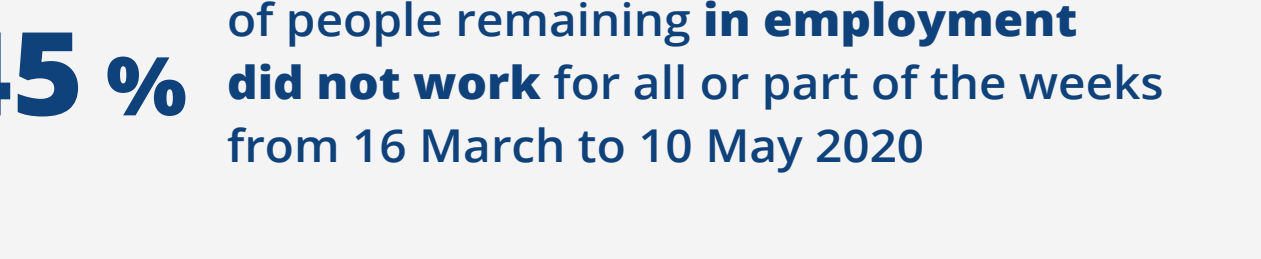


Change between 2019 and 2020 in cumulative all-cause deaths between 1 March and 30 April

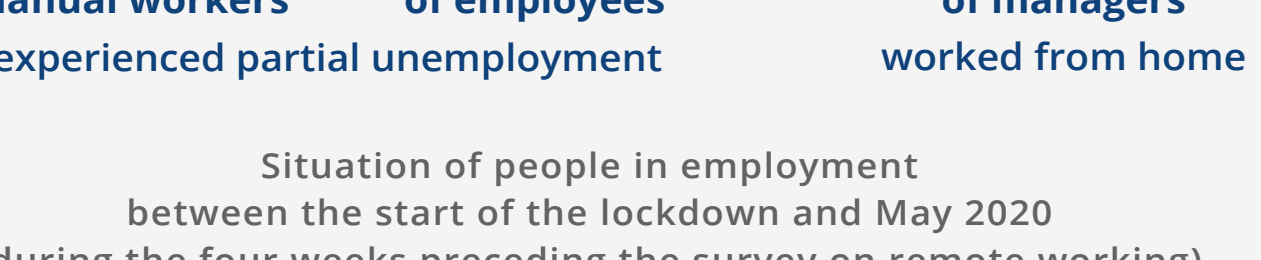
THE RISK OF EXPOSURE TO THE VIRUS VARIES ACCORDING TO THE SOCIAL BACKGROUNDS



JOB LOSS AFFECTED THOSE IN THE MOST INSECURE SITUATIONS FIRST



FALL IN ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IS MAINLY DUE TO THE DECREASE IN WORKED HOURS

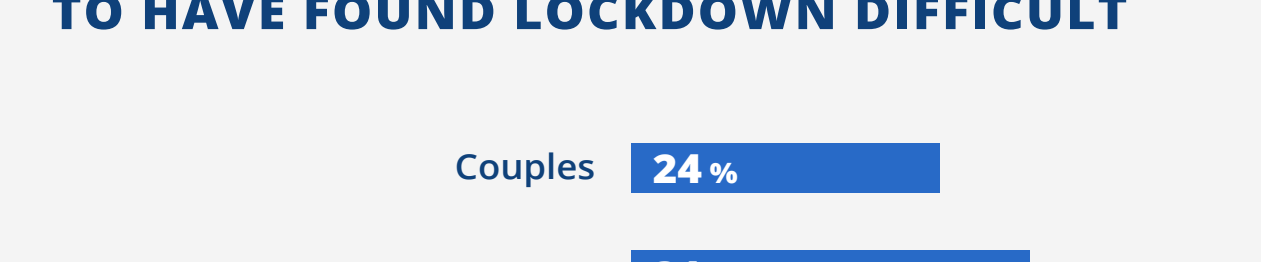


MANUAL WORKERS AND EMPLOYEES MORE LIKELY TO BE PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED WHILE MANAGERS WORKED REMOTELY



Situation of people in employment between the start of the lockdown and May 2020 (during the four weeks preceding the survey on remote working)

23 % OF HOUSEHOLDS WERE OF THE VIEW THAT THEIR FINANCIAL SITUATION HAD WORSENERD, PARTICULARLY AMONG THOSE WHOSE ACTIVITY WAS REDUCED

PEOPLE LIVING ALONE WERE MORE LIKELY THAN COUPLES TO HAVE FOUND LOCKDOWN DIFFICULT



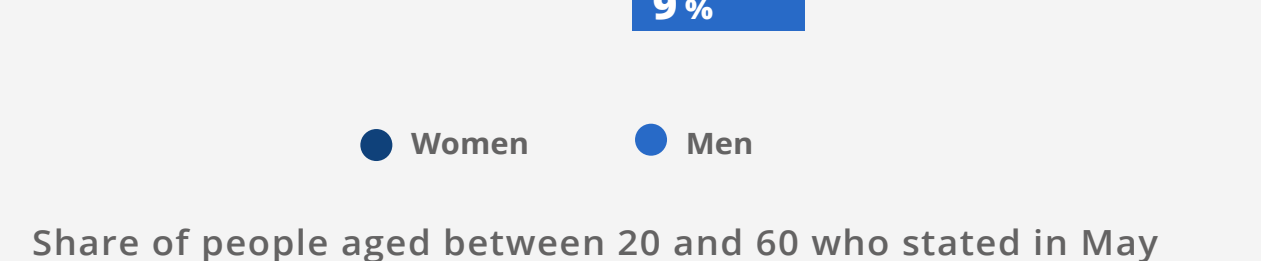
Share of people who stated in May 2020 lockdown difficult

THE SIZE OF HOUSING HAD AN IMPACT: THE POOREST HOUSEHOLDS AND THOSE WITH CHILDREN LIVE MORE FREQUENTLY IN OVERCROWDED HOUSING



Share of households living in overcrowded housing in 2016 according to the type of households; in overcrowded housing in 2013 according to the standard of living

WOMEN CONTINUED TO TAKE ON MOST OF DOMESTIC TASKS EVEN WHEN THEY WORKED OUTSIDE THE HOME



Share of people aged between 20 and 60 who stated in May 2020, dedicating 4 hours and more a day to domestic tasks during the lockdown, depending on professional activities.

MORE CONFLICTS THAN USUAL, PARTICULARLY FOR COUPLES LIVING IN OVERCROWDED HOUSING OR WITH CHILDREN



Share of people who stated in May 2020, more conflicts than usual during the lockdown

A THIRD OF SECONDARY LEVEL PUPILS HAVING EDUCATIONAL DIFFICULTIES DEVOTED 3 HOURS OR MORE PER DAY TO THEIR EDUCATION, COMPARED WITH HALF OF PUPILS WITHOUT EDUCATIONAL DIFFICULTIES

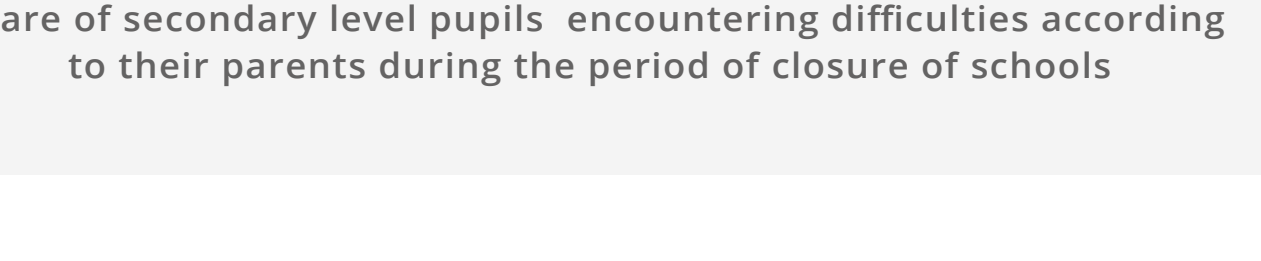

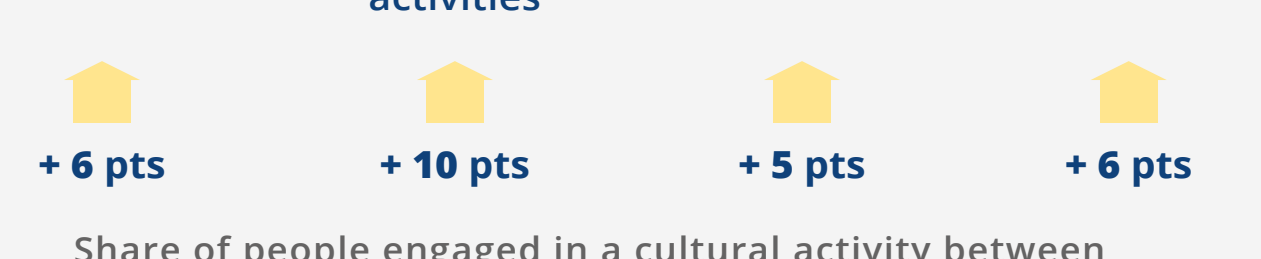
Share of secondary level pupils encountering difficulties according to their parents during the period of closure of schools
