ONS in the headlines

One in three Britons live in a COVID-FREE zone: Calls for a quicker end to lockdown as figures show number of areas with no cases has doubled in a week

- Some areas have had no new infections for a month, according to official data
- Counties are divided into 6,791 zones, known as Middle Super Output Areas
- Outbreaks are recorded if the number of new infections is greater than two
- 2,426 of them in England had effectively no new cases in the week up to March




Number of deaths due to COVID-19 in Middle Layer Super Output Areas, death registered between March to December 2020, England and Wales



Proportion of the workforce by working arrangements, for responding businesses that were still trading or had temporarily paused trading, UK, 23 March 2020 to 5 April 2020








London has the highest percentage of its population within easy reach of a public park



Figure 2: The gap in unpaid work between men and women remains large at over an hour per day


Minutes of main activity a day by sex for adults aged 18 years and over, 2014 to 2015 for the UK and 28 March to 26 April 2020 for Great Britain




