ECOSOC 2020/19: Working Group on Ageing Standing Working Group

- Works to improve policymaking in accordance with the principles of the MIPAA/RIS and 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development
- In 2018-2022, focuses on the priorities outlined in
 2017 Lisbon Ministerial Declaration and SDGs
- Works towards integrating population ageing and MIPAA/RIS with the national/regional follow-up on 2030 Agenda and other relevant global programmes

Focus on:


- ➤ access to essential goods and health and long-term care services, sensitivity to specific needs and preferences, resurging ageism



2019-2020: Task Force & secretariat

- Stocktaking: 23 country notes received
- Consultation: 21 reviews10 member States & 11 NGOs and experts
- Revised draft: approved by SWGA at its 13th meeting on 20 Nov. 2020

2021: operationalizing the Guidelines

- ➤ Launch events:
 OEWG-A /New York (29 Mach -1April) and
 Social Summit in Porto (May) under Portuguese EU Presidency
- > Development of a tool kit and first capacity-building workshop

Capacity-building

- Road map for mainstreaming ageing in Kazakhstan, including rapid assessment of Covid-19 impact on LTC provision (Autumn 2021)
- Capacity development workshops to support preparation of national reports on MIPAA/RIS (April-July 2021)
- UNFPA, WHO, UNECE, OHCHR and HelpAge International Joint programme on Ageing: Building forward better in light of COVID-19



4th review and appraisal of the MIPAA/RIS

2020:

- The UNECE guidelines for national reports (September 2020)
- SWGA started acting as Preparatory Committee (November 2020)
- Italy proposed to host 2022 UNECE Ministerial Conference in Rome

From Lisbon in 2017 to Rome in 2022



2021 milestones:

- March July: supporting national review processes
- September: member States submit national review reports
- October: First briefing to member States on format and provisional programme of the 2022 Ministerial Conference
- **November:**14th SWGA meeting outline for the Synthesis Report; draft ministerial declaration under in-depth discussion
- December: Launch of the first round of formal consultation on a draft ministerial declaration



Supporting the SWGA work programme

SWGA secretariat - regular budget resources 2021

- P5 Chief of unit & G6 Programme assistant
- As of 4 January 2021, no P2 Associate population affairs officer due to recruitment freeze

Technical cooperation - 'Ageing - phase III' fund

- In Jan. 2020, contributions from Austria, Estonia, Germany, Norway, Portugal and Switzerland amounted to USD 271,000
- In the course of 2020/early 2021, additional contributions received from Estonia (USD 3,300), Germany (USD 179,200) and Switzerland (USD 20,000)

UNECE Regular Programme for Technical Cooperation

- In Sept. 2020, USD 10,000 for a Rapid assessment of Covid-19 impact on LTC pilot study
- In 2021, allotment of USD 17,000
