<b>Title of intervention, country and name of presenter</b>	The availability of data <b>The Republic of Serbia</b> <b>Sandra Nedeljkovic</b> <b>Public Investment Management Office</b>
<b>Brief description</b>	Serbia has adopted the Disaster Risk Reduction Law on 2018 with full Sendai implementation. The National, provincial and local level are obliged to develop Disaster Risk Assessments, Rescue and Protection Plans and Disaster Risk Reduction Plan. Those documents are first step to plan resilience society. Availability of data, documents and plans on multilevel governance is needed.
<b>Policy goal(s) or challenge(s) to be addressed</b>	
<b>Instruments and proposals</b>	Each plan needs to have multi hazard approach. Epidemic needs to be part of risk assessment. Epidemic measures are to be integral part of response plans. Lessons learned in COV19 situation have to be integrated in updated response plans at all government levels. Serbia has developed online platform with disaster risk management local plans and is developing national DRM geospatial platform.
<b>Constraints and difficulties</b>	The data are not available, are not updated, plans are not developed, plans are not developed with all stakeholders...
