Russian Federation	Support of the Working Group (includes financial support of participants from the Caucasus, Central Asia and Eastern Europe and consultancy for country profiles)	\$80,000, of which about \$5,000 remains, first half of 2021 only (so to be returned)
Norway	Promotion of Environmental Protection and Cooperation in the UNECE Region, 2018-2020	Approximately \$4,800 for 2020 (now exhausted)
Austria	Financial support for participants from South-Eastern Europe	Funds for 2019 exhausted

Germany	Pan-European environmental assessment	€10,000, all committed	
Serbia	Pan-European environmental assessment	€5,000, of which about \$3,000 committed	
Netherlands	Pan-European environmental assessment (through Environment for Europe fund)	Approx. €20,000, of which \$13,560 committed
