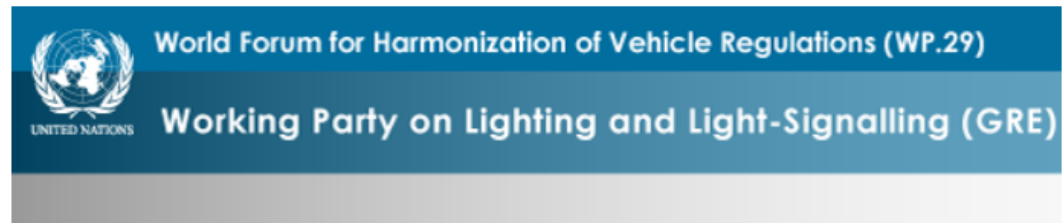

Working Party on Lighting and Light-Signalling - Introduction



The Working Party on Lighting and Light-Signalling (GRE) is the subsidiary body of the World Forum for Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations (WP.29) that prepares regulatory proposals on active safety, specifically regarding vehicle Lighting and Light-Signalling to WP.29. This group of experts conducts research and analysis to develop lighting requirements for vehicles.

GRE convenes officially twice a year and entrusts informal groups with specific problems that need to be solved urgently or that require special expertise. More than 80 experts participate at the sessions of GRE.

The Working Party is open to the governmental experts from any member country of the United Nations, and to any regional economic integration organization set up by member countries of the United Nations, and to experts of governmental organizations. Experts of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) may participate in a consultative capacity. Final decisions are taken by Government representatives by vote at the World Forum WP.29 level.

Highlights of the recent session(s) of WP.29

November 2020

- Opening statement of Dr. James Owens, NHTSA Deputy Administrator (WP.29-182-20)
- Mr. Anikeev (Russian Federation) elected as Vice-Chair of WP.29
- WP.29 endorsed a proposal by IWG IWVTA to amend provision V9 in the Guidelines on Transitional Provisions:
- ~~V.9. Contracting Parties applying this Regulation shall not refuse to grant type approvals according to any preceding series of amendments to this Regulation or extensions thereof.~~
- “V.9. Contracting Parties applying this UN Regulation may grant type approvals according to any preceding series of amendments to this Regulation.
- V.9bis. Contracting Parties applying this UN Regulation shall continue to grant extensions of existing approvals to any preceding series of amendments to this Regulation.”

Highlights of the recent session(s) of WP.29

March 2021

- All GRE amendment proposals (21 documents) adopted
- WP.29 agreed with a proposal of IWG DETA to grant Market Surveillance Authorities access to DETA under certain conditions
- WP.29 invited IWGs on SLR and DETA to develop the proposal related to the use of DETA in the context of Unique Identifier
- WP.29 invited the secretariat to call for an informal meeting at AC.2 level to discuss financing of DETA
