

Updated activities foreseen for Programme Area 2 Programme of Work 2022-2024

• Good practices and lessons learned in transboundary data exchange will be collected. This will require considering e.g. the acquisition and collection of data, their harmonization and management in line with the structure of the Strategies on Monitoring and Assessment of Transboundary Rivers, Lakes and Groundwaters. Development of a brochure/publication foreseen integrating these lessons learned from different regions → A coherent product, complementary to the Strategies.



Updated activities foreseen for Programme Area 2 Programme of Work 2022-2024

- The Strategies for Monitoring and Assessment of Transboundary Rivers, Lakes and Groundwaters will be updated as a global edition and printed in Arabic, Spanish, English, French and Russian.
- Up to three training or regional workshops/sessions on monitoring, information and data will be organized. Raise awareness about the approach to monitoring and assessment under the Water Convention, learn about regional experiences, collect additional insights for the Strategies (serving the validation of the global edition). These events will be subject to requests and opportunities for partnerships with regional partners and countries.
- Tailored assistance and support for developing joint or coordinated monitoring or information and data exchange will be provided upon request, such as in the Drin Basin and in the Senegalo-Mauritanian aquifer.
- Synergy will be sought with other programme areas, notably with National Policy Dialogues on Integrated Water Resources Management (activity 3.4).
