ECTD's Contributions to UNECE's Convening Function: International PPP Forum and Regional Forum on Sustainable Development (RFSD)

5th International PPP Forum: "Building Back Better through People-first Public Private Partnerships"

UNECE's 5th International Public-Private-Partnership (PPP) Forum, with more than 300 registered participants. The Forum took place in hybrid mode from 22 April – 26 April 2021, and focused on the theme "Building Back Better." The Forum's international debate is helping to raise the profile of the people-first approach to PPPs among key stakeholders and to mainstream the Building Back Better objective into PPP-related policy making. The Forum also provided a platform for local authorities to identify priority projects in infrastructure and PPPs that can build community resilience. Finally, participants to the Forum selected the ultimate winner of the UNECE Building Back Better infrastructure award, choosing from the top 5 of 66 submitted projects. A total of 881 electronic votes were cast. The winner is Brazil, Piauí State, for its fruit and vegetable market project. The joint runners up are Spain, Tenerife light railway project, and the Philippines, regional development programme in Caraga. Videos of the projects are available online. The competition helped to test and obtain feedback on UNECE's draft People-first PPP Evaluation Methodology for the Sustainable Development Goals.

2021 Regional Forum on Sustainable Development (RFSD)

UNECE's 2021 Regional Forum on "Sustainable and resilient recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic and action and delivery on the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development in the UNECE Region" was held during 9 days with rich and stimulating discussions focusing on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 1, 2, 3, 8, 10, 12, 13 across 12 peer learning roundtables, over 20 side events and 7 Voluntary National Reviews. The results were presented at the Global High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development on 5-16 July this year.
