

Proposal for amendments to UN Regulation No. [162] (Immobilizers)

I. Proposal

Paragraph 5.2.1.1., amend to read:

"5.2.1.1. An immobilizer shall be designed so as to prevent the operation of the vehicle under its own **motive** power by at least one of the following means:

...,

II. Justification

- 1. The paragraphs 5.3.1.1., 5.2.13. and 8.3.1.1. of UN Regulation No. 116 address the same intent of protection of normal use of the vehicle/powertrain/engine with however three different wordings.
- 2. This proposal aims to clarify the difference between using the engine as a power source for motion versus using the engine as a power source for another use (e.g. heating).
- 3. The proposal above aligns paragraph 5.2.1.1. on the wording of paragraph 5.2.13. of UN Regulation No. 116 on the concept of normal use of the vehicle main power source.
