	The decision was made in spite of Romania's Ministry of Enviroment request to assess the transboundary impact - official adress attached to the email. We hereby mention the similar case of the PLEX of two nuclear units at the Rivne NPP, Ukraine and the decision of the Committee to begin an initiative in 2013, with the conclusion that lifetime extension of a nuclear unit is a major change to an activity and should be subject to an EIA and transboundary procedures. We also mention that Unit 5 from Kozloduy NPP has already received a
