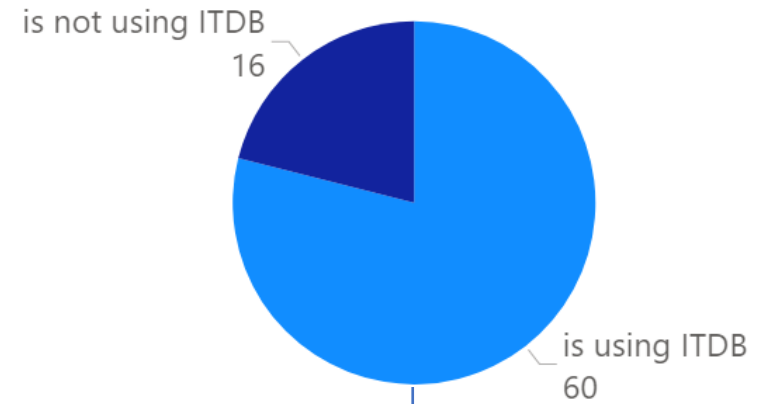

General ITDB data status

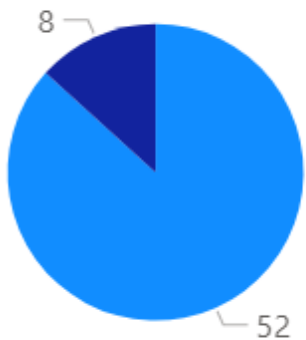
- 1,127 web application users *(since 2018)* +8

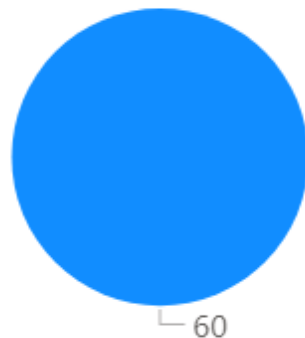
Contracting Parties with ITDB users since 2018



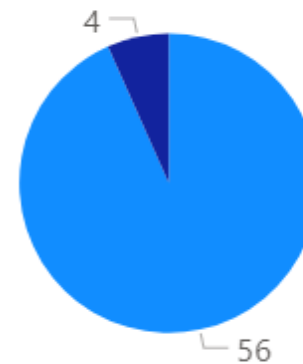
Active Contracting Parties with holder data



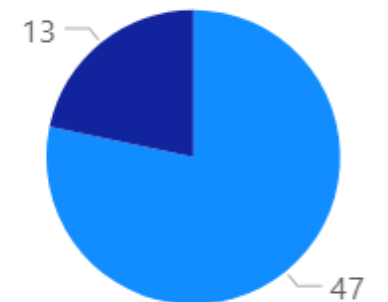
Active Contracting Parties with Customs or Nat. Associations users

● Has cust. offices ● No cust. office

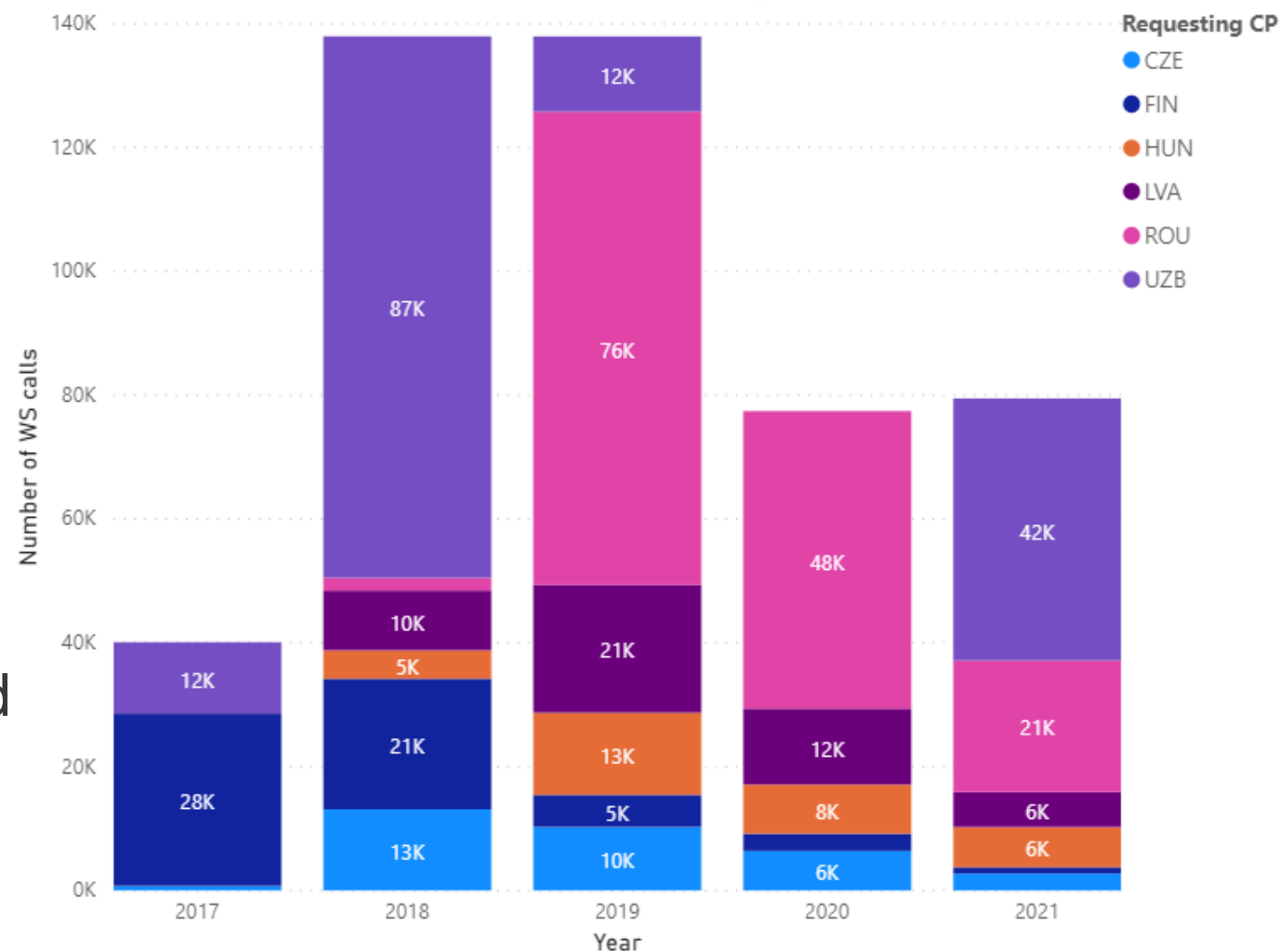
ITDB web service status

- Approximately 138,000 web service calls per year in 2018 and 2019.
 - 77,700 web service calls in 2020.
 - 79,560 web service calls in 2021 so far (as of 08/06/2021).
- 6¹ Contracting Parties (CP) are actively using ITDB web services (and 8² CP are the in process of testing).

Recent achievements

- Continue collecting feedback regarding the 2 currently opened ITDB surveys:
 - Expectations on the future Certificate of Approval module (re-opened – 27 responses so far)
 - Digitalization progress of the Certificate of Approval at national customs level for all contracting parties (19 responses so far)
- Imported Uzbekistan customs data and currently assisting China customs authorities
- Started working on the specifications for the TIR Carnet holder web portal.

Future releases and other activities planned for the second half of 2021

- Collect both survey answers and draft analysis reports (and for the CoA survey, present amendment proposals to the latest CoA technical design/specifications - TIRExB informal document 5 2020)
- Complete the TIR Carnet holder portal specifications and start developing it
- Continue supporting contracting parties in customs office data import
- Continue aligning ITDB with the requirements of the eTIR international system.
