

# Project Purpose

- A multimodal corridor in international trade comprises three base elements relating to cargo moving from place A to B: (1) change of mode of transport; (2) crossing international borders; (3) change of international modal convention (e.g. CIM to SGMS). This project will concentrate on the related regulatory aspects.
- The purpose of this project is to create guidance material on corridor set ups and further build on the existing data pipeline model to create Linkage and establish appropriate standards for exchange of information between ports and airports of two countries.



# Project Scope

- Study of the need of multimodal digital corridors for air/sea/land modes of transport with focus on regulatory authorities
- Study of reusability of information between origin and destination stakeholders
- Study of existing similar initiatives
- Study the potential of integrating with Single Window initiatives
- Study of other factors that delay cargo processing at air/sea/land borders that could be addressed through multimodal corridors
- Consider the common data elements with respect to the CBM-RDM
- Identify the regulatory aspects of key steps in setting up the air/sea/land corridors
- Study the possible regulatory challenges in setting up of digital corridors
- Identify technologies that can facilitate creation of regulatory-related multimodal digital corridors
