

# Discussion on further activities on climate change adaptation for the next Programme of Work under the Water Convention for 2022-2024

#### **Future potential areas of activites**



- Capacity building activities to share best practices
  - Global thematic workshops on transboundary climate change adaptation
  - Activities of the Global network of basins working on climate change
- Capacity-building activities on preparing bankable projects proposals for climate change adaptation in transboundary basins
- Cooperation with funds to promote financing transboundary climate change adaptation
- Disaster risk management (flood and droughts, minimizing impacts on water and sanitation and related health risks)

### Future potential areas of activities



- Support to particular basins in development and implementation of the adaptation strategies and plans (e.g. Sava basin)
- Mainstreaming water and transboundary adaptation into national and basin planning documents (e.g. ecosystem-based adaptation into NAP and transboundary water management, coherence between RBMPs and NAPs)
- Cooperation with global policy processes on climate and disasters such as under the UNFCCC, UNDRR and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development

## Topics of interest based on the questionnaire



- Data management and sharing, monitoring
- Governance and intersectoral coordination and dialogue
- Climate change impacts on transboundary basins, adaptation policies and measures
- Raising awareness on social and economic consequences of climate change
- Integrating nexus considerations into adaptation
- Water scarcity, environmental flows and water infrastructure to meet environmental requirements
- Water quality impacts and reducing pollution in the context of climate change

#### The Task Force



- Encouraged countries to mainstream transboundary aspects of water management into their national climate-related documents such as, for example, Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) and National Adaptation Plans (NAPs), and to liaise with colleagues responsible for climate change issues and disaster risk reduction;
- Encouraged the participants to apply the findings of the background paper *Mainstreaming* water and transboundary cooperation into climate-related documents into their work to
   mainstream the central role of water and the benefits of transboundary cooperation into
   climate-related documents;
- Encouraged the participants to submit their suggestions for future activities on climate
   change adaptation in transboundary basins in the framework of the planned survey on the
   next programme of work for 2022-2024 under the Water Convention;
- Decided to organize the twelfth meeting the Task Force on Water and Climate back-to-back
  with the global workshop on climate change adaptation with a focus on health in cooperation
  with the Protocol on Water and Health on 29-31 March 2020.
