- Indicators difficult to measure or have limited coverage

- Medium-term targets for Green City Actions determined
- Monitoring of implementation of actions and progress toward objective and targets
- Political Commitment to Green City Action Plan
- Mitigation of environmental challenges and risks and improvement of environment

KEY LESSONS LEARNED

- Need for indicators
- Private sector involvement enhances cities environmental performance
- NGOs and CSOs environmental initiatives (support for solid waste collection and treatment)
