I. Opening and adoption of agenda

1. Ms. Maia Bitadze, Chair, outlined the main objectives of the meeting, namely, to consider any new or pending issues that need to be addressed by the Bureau with regard to preparations for the seventh session of the Aarhus Convention's Meeting of the Parties (Geneva, 18-21 October 2021). The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Chair and adopted the provisional agenda of the meeting.

II. Update on preparations for the seventh session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Aarhus Convention

2. The Bureau considered several issues, notably the required factual update for several draft decisions, including decisions on reporting requirements and on public participation in decision-making. The Bureau also took note of a draft supplementary report prepared by the Compliance Committee with regard to decision VI/8c concerning the compliance of Belarus². The Bureau agreed to wait for the comments of the Party concerned on the draft supplementary report, and for the subsequent finalisation of the supplementary report by the Committee, and to take any possible further steps, as appropriate, through electronic decision-making.
