

What is ASTM?

An International Standards Development Organization

- Established in 1898
- 148 Committees & 12,700+ Standards
- 30,000+ members
 - 8,000+ International Members from 150 countries
 - 8,000 ASTM standards used in 75 countries
- Accreditation:
 - American National Standards Institute (ANSI)
 - Standards Council of Canada (SCC)
- Process complies with WTO principles: Annex 4 of WTO/TBT Agreement

– SCOPE OF THE STUDY

- Developed in the context of the OECD Partnership of International Organisations for Effective International Rule-Making
- Studies ASTM International's standard-setting practices and related governance mechanisms
- Study contributes to the OECD's analytical work on international rulemaking with the perspective of an atypical form of international organization
- Study is relevant considering the world's increasing reliance on the deliverables produced by international private standard-setting organisations
