Report of the Special session

I. Attendance

- 1. The Global Forum for Road Traffic Safety (WP.1) held a special session on 9 December 2021, chaired by Ms. Luciana Iorio (Italy) Representatives of the following ECE member States participated: Austria, Belgium, Canada, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Israel, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Portugal, Russian Federation, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and United States of America.
- 2. The representatives of non-ECE member States also participated: Australia, Brazil, India, Japan, and State of Palestine.
- 3. The European Union, and the following non-governmental organizations were also represented: Africa Alliance for Health Research and Economic Development, American Automotive Policy Council (AAPC), European Transport Safety Council (ETSC), European Association for Automotive Suppliers (CLEPA), Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA), SAE International, International Motorcycle Manufacturers Association (IMMA), International Organization of Motor Vehicle Manufacturers (OICA), University of Brussels, Università degli Studi di Genova, University of South Carolina, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Traffic Psychology Unit of Research (UCSC) and Motorists services Organisation of Zimbabwe (MSOZ).
