Context

- **Forest Landscape Restoration is very high in the international agenda, including UN Decade for Ecosystem Restoration, Bonn Challenge, ECCA30.**
- **The Caucasus and Central Asia region actively responded to these initiatives, primarily through the Astana Ministerial Conference, and follow up work.**
 - **However, the region is not well known and recognized in particular in a global scale.**

Context

- **International organizations responded to the related needs, developing guidance, training material and providing tools for sharing knowledge and exchanging of information and discussion.**
 - **However, primarily for language and regional specificity, these developments are of limited relevance and availability for the region**
- **As follow up to the Astana Ministerial, CCA countries continues regional cooperation in this regard, including through the development of the regional guidance for crating national strategies for FLR.**
 - **However, this work is done through a set of separate activities without an information hub that would help to organize work and manage ongoing and expected outputs.**

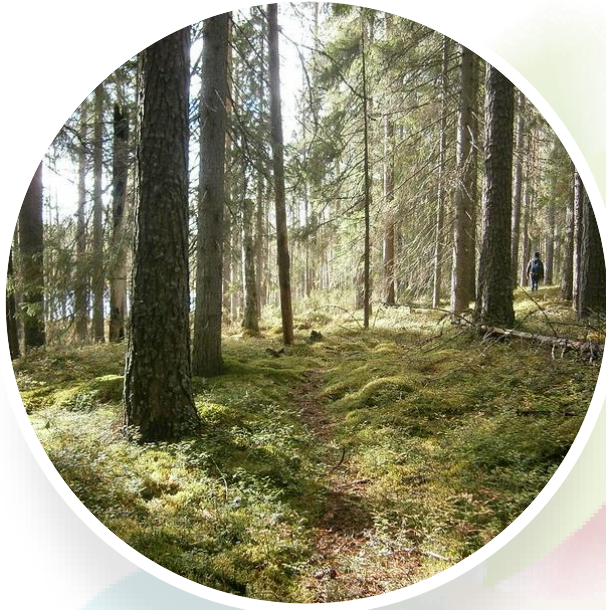
Objectives

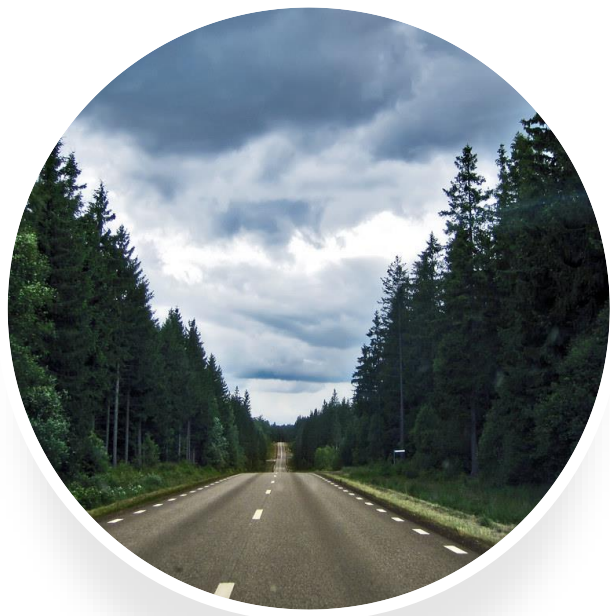
