Further to the questions raised by the Compliance Committee (ACCC) at the open session, I have attached further information provided by the London Borough of Barnet (LBB) for urgent onward forwarding to the ACCC ahead of their deliberations on C190.

Local Plan

The United Kingdom points to LBB's 'Local Development Scheme', which the Council published online in Sept 2021. It states that the Examination in Public of the emerging Barnet Local Plan will take place in "mid 2022", and that "subject to outcome of examination" LBB expect to formally adopt the plan in early 2023". The communicant's Annex 2C contains "draft" Local Plan documents, which remains the status of the Local Plan. It has not been adopted: it must first undergo examination in public and further public consultation before being adopted.
