More than 1000 participants in our meetings




More than 60,000 people over social media on topics such as Forests4Fashion, urban forestry, wood construction, boreal forests, wildfires, green jobs and more

INForest web platform launched to increase data outreach, translated and replicated at national levels.








Our work in 2021- update on our youngest ToS

Highlight: impact achieved in 2021

Over 4 million hectares of forest land committed for restoration under the Bonn Challenge in Eastern and South-East Europe. Ministerial Declaration adopted.



- Scenarios for future forest management challenges until 2040 developed through the **Forest Sector Outlook Study**
- 29 cities in 25 countries pledged to plant close ton 10.5 million trees under the Trees in Cities Challenge. An Informal Network of Experts on Sustainable Urban Forestry was established to provide support to practitioners to identify, share, and adopt best practices and replicable solutions https://treesincities.unece.org/

Preview 2022 – some examples

- Improve the data base about the impacts of biotic and abiotic disturbances
- Disseminate the Forest Sector Outlook study and thereby help forest managers and policy-makers consider the trade-offs involved in complex forest management decisions
- Continue to strengthen the dialogue between boreal forest scientists and policy-makers to address climate-related challenges
- Help local authorities and mayors to improve their urban forestry strategies
- Help countries in the Caucasus and Central Asia in their forest landscapes restauration strategies and approaches
- Gather more and better statistics on forest products and wood energy
- Stronger communication and awareness campaigns (e.g. Trees in Cities, Forests4Fashion, IDF)
