THE STATE OF THE WORLD'S FORESTS









Forests and trees are vital for sustainable development, addressing global crises and sustainable recovery:



- They cover 31% of the terrestrial land area; about 4.06 billion hectares.
- Forests have become a carbon sink over the last decade.
 - Gross forest-related emissions are estimated at 8.1 ± 2.5 gigatonnes of CO₂ per year;
 - Gross removals 16 ± 49 gigatonnes of CO2 per year.
- Forests are home to most of the world's terrestrial biodiversity.
- Biodiversity loss, deforestation and forest fragmentation have amplified health risks such as COVID-19.
- For millions of people living in poverty, forest and tree resources not only provide food, fuel for cooking and heating, medicine, shelter and clothing, but they also function as safety nets in crises or emergencies.
- Forest smallholders and communities will be key players in the green recovery and development, in solving current issues and in working towards more sustainable solutions.









The report will present three forest-based solution pathways.

- Protecting forests, reducing deforestation and forest degradation
- 2. Restoring and improving degraded landscapes and putting more trees into agricultural settings
- Enhancing the sustainable use of forest resources towards a green recovery and sustainable economies

Call from the United Nations Secretary-General

Antonio Guterres to "Turn the tide on deforestation":

We must halt deforestation, restore degraded forests and change the way we farm

Working across Sectors to Halt Deforestation and Increase Forest Area – from Aspiration to Action

- Call from the United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to Turn the tide on deforestation: "We must halt deforestation, restore degraded forests and change the way we farm"
- FAO and UNEP asked to lead a concerted effort of UN agencies to halt deforestation and forest degradation
- Identifying "key messages" from reliable facts and figures
- Joint statement of the CPF: Challenges and Opportunities in Turning the Tide on Deforestation
- A CPF Joint Initiative on turning the tide on deforestation is being developed to further support efforts of countries







The UN Food Systems Summit 2021





Designed to **develop principles** and identify, raise awareness of, and elevate public discussion about **positive solutions** for improving global food systems and **generate significant action** towards implementing those solutions in support of the SDGs

Outcomes:

- 'National pathways' for food systems transformation
- <u>Coalitions</u> formed with support from Member States
- 'Collaboration hub' hosted by FAO
- Global stocktaking meeting every 2 years

Forests represented in coalitions under Action Area 2 – Boost Nature-Based Solutions of Production:

- Halting deforestation and conversion from agricultural commodities
- Coalition on Better Data Better Decisions for Nature-Positive Production
- <u>Coalition for the Transformation of Food Systems Through</u> <u>Agroecology</u>
- Land and Freshwater Nexus









UNFCCC and CBD





26th Session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 26) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) 1-12 Nov. 2021, Glasgow, UK

- Adopted Glasgow Climate Pact that explicitly recognizes key role of forests in climate change mitigation, adaptation and resilience.
- Finalized rules of the Paris Agreement, including Article
 6.
- Announced Glasgow Leaders' Declaration on Forests and Land Use: 140 countries pledged to halt and reverse deforestation by 2030 with more than USD 20 billion committed.
- NFO held 26 events, including high-level 'Turning the Tide on Deforestation'

The UN Biodiversity Conference (CBD COP15), 11-15 October 2021 (Part I) and 25 April-8 May 2022 (Part II), Kunming, China

- Adopted Kunming Declaration demonstrating political support for ambitious post-2020 global biodiversity framework (will be finalized in 2022)
- Mainstreaming of biodiversity remains one of the key elements needed for a successful post-2020 framework
- Progress review of the implementation the Strategic Plan for Biodiversity 2011-2020







The 16th session of the UNFF



- 26-30 April 2021, New York (technical, virtual)
- FAO contributed to high level and plenary sessions
- Endorsement of themes for IDF 2022: Forests and Sustainable Production and Consumption and IDF 2023: Forests and Health
- The output: Chair's Summary, transmitted to UNFF17 (policy session), 9-13 May 2022, New York

- UNFF17: The implementation of the UNSPF and preparations for the midterm review in 2024 of the effectiveness of the IAF
