2. Development of the permanent marking of the Unique Rail Vehicle Identification System

The Group of Experts may wish to discuss the development of the permanent marking of the Unique Rail Vehicle Identification System (URVIS) as set out in the terms of reference. The following points may be discussed:

(a) Best practices in, and national requirements for rolling stock marking

Member States may wish to share best practice in, and national requirements for rolling stock building on previous presentations at previous sessions. This agenda item will also review the use cases for the placing of the URVIS on rolling stock (previously agenda item 2(b). Finally, experts will be updated on developments with the Luxembourg Rail Protocol.

(b) Development of the framework

During discussions at the previous sessions of the Group, Experts agreed that further work should be done on the Model Rules for the placing of the URVIS number. This was to be done by the updating of document ECE/TRANS/SC.2/PIRRS/2021/8. Document ECE/TRANS/SC.2/PIRRS/2022/4 sets out the updated text for discussion at the session. Document ECE/TRANS/SC.2/PIRRS/2022/5 provides commentary on the changes. As part of discussions on the Model Rules, experts may wish to discuss the options for the marking of railway rolling stock as set out in Appendix I of the Model Rules set out in ECE/TRANS/SC.2/PIRRS/2022/4.

In relation to the request of the Group to further understand the requirements for the Revisions Committee of the Model Rules, the secretariat has prepared document ECE/TRANS/SC.2/PIRRS/2022/3 setting out possible options for the Revisions Committee. Delegates may wish to discuss the development of the model rules further at this session.

The Group of Experts may also wish to be updated on developments in relation the Draft Regulations for the International Registry.
