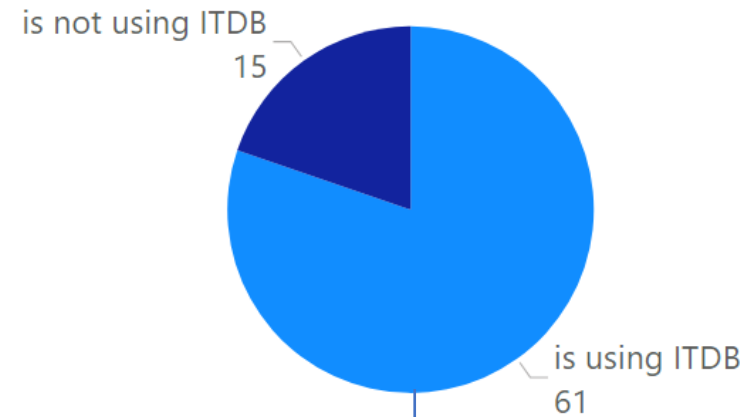

General ITDB data status

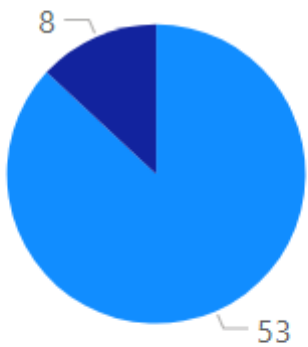
- 1,128 web application users *(since 2018)*

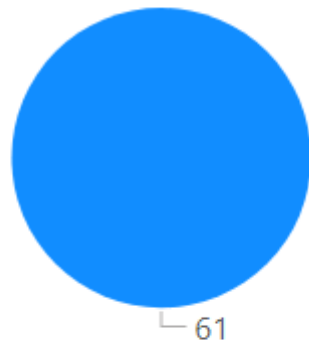
Contracting Parties with ITDB users since 2018



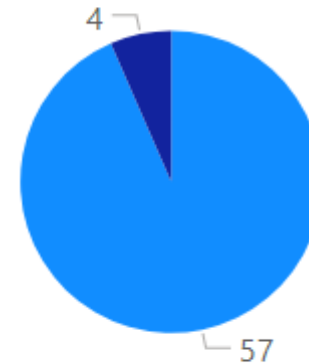
Active Contracting Parties with holder data



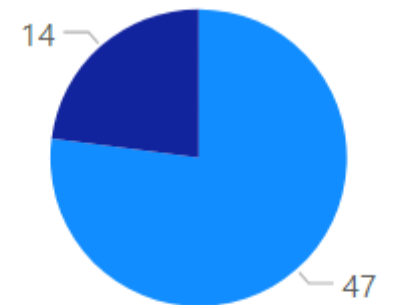
Active Contracting Parties with Customs or Nat. Associations users

● Has cust. offices ● No cust. office

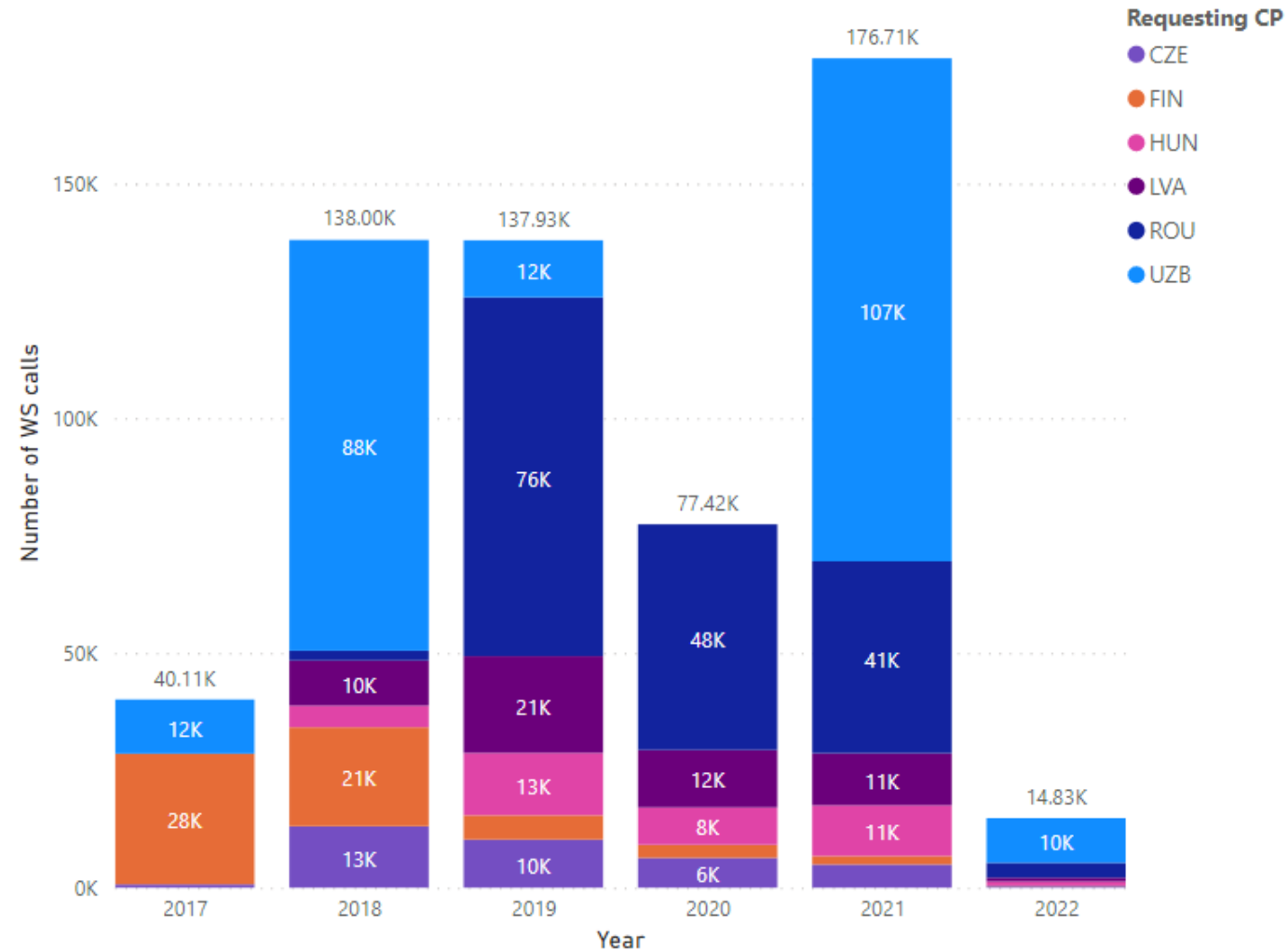
ITDB web service status

- Approximately 138,000 web service calls per year in 2018 and 2019.
 - 77,700 WS calls in 2020.
 - 176,710 WS calls in 2021
 - 14,830 WS calls so far (as of 02/02/2022).

Recent achievements

- Sent official communication (letters) to all Heads of customs to remind them of the mandatoriness of using ITDB to communicate Holder information (entry into force on 4 February 2022).
- Closed the two ITDB related surveys (related to the future Certificates of Approval module)
 - Presented the answers analysis and reports to the TIRExB.
 - Decision from the TIRExB to postpone work on this initiative temporary to handle current priorities.
- Completed creation additional System Integration Testing environment (container based)
- Started internal testing of the TIR Carnet holder web portal.
- Started internal testing on ITDB improvements to notify by email holder of change of status.
- Started work on mobile application specifications
 - Dedicated presentation after this status report

Future releases and other activities planned for Q2 2022

- Complete internal testing of the ITDB changes and TIR Carnet holder portal and start User Acceptance Testing (welcoming volunteers to assist on that phase).
- Start work on Mobile applications development
- Continue supporting contracting parties in customs office data import.
- Continue aligning ITDB with the requirements of the eTIR international system.
