Benefits of joint monitoring

- Mutual support in establishing a monitoring system
- Agreement on and approvement of monitoring parameters and methods
- Harmonization of results
- Improved basin-wide, transparent, harmonized, 'neutral' and reliable information and data
- Improved understanding of the basin
- Improved forecasting, impact assessment and dissemination of results for better decision-making;
- Improved early warning
- Development of regular common reports
- Shared concepts of pressures and impacts common ground for cooperation

Update of the Strategies on Monitoring and Assessment

- Strategic approach is still largely valid
- Add information on:
 - Procedures for data management and data exchange
 - Sustainability aspects / financing / legal basis
 - Differences between rivers, lakes and groundwaters
- Update with new definitions and references
- Extent ECE region to worldwide
- Include stronger link water quality/groundwater/ecology
- Emphasize joint design of monitoring networks and joint sampling campaigns
- Re-enforce need of capacity development at national and transboundary levels
- New technologies and methodologies
- Improve inclusiveness (gender) and participation of all stakeholders
