

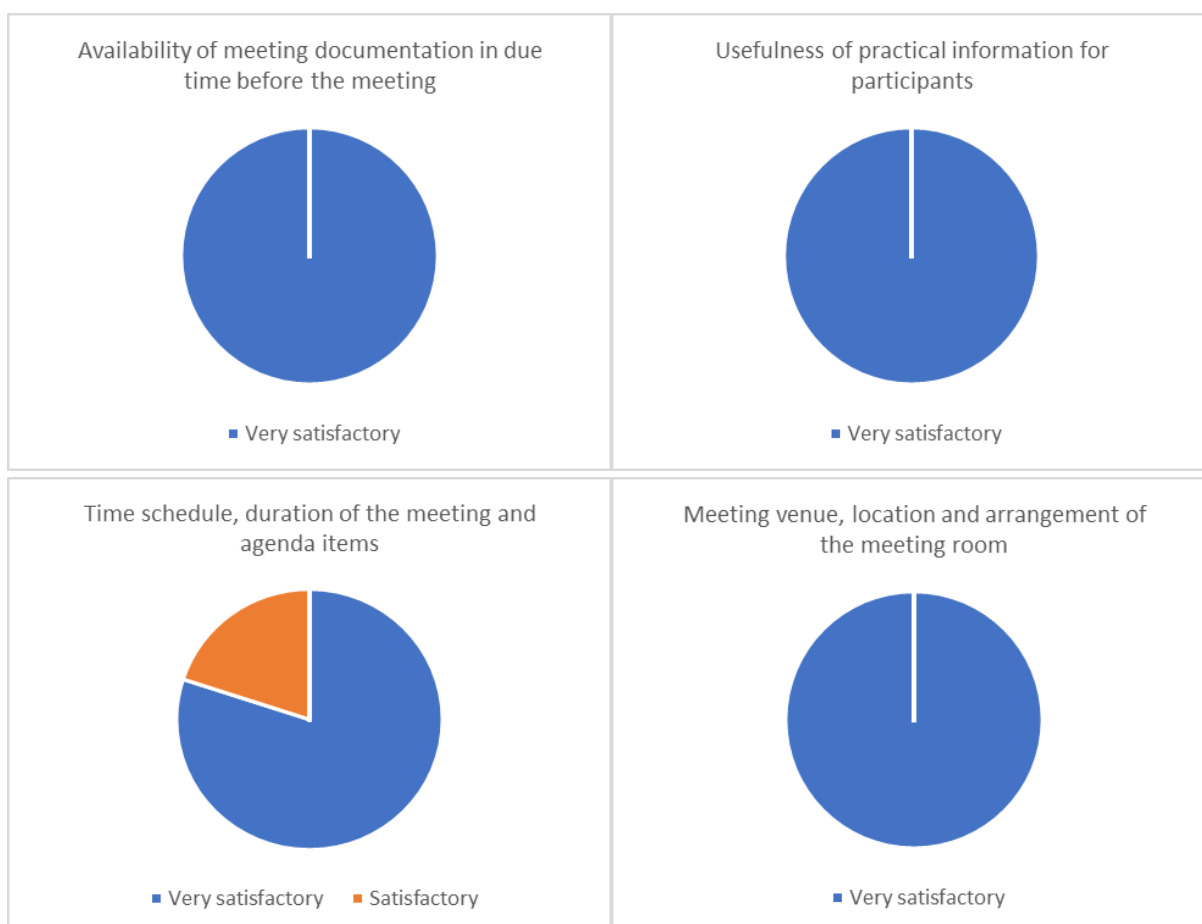
**First meeting of the Steering Committee to the National Policy Dialogues

(Belgrade, Serbia, 16 March 2022)**

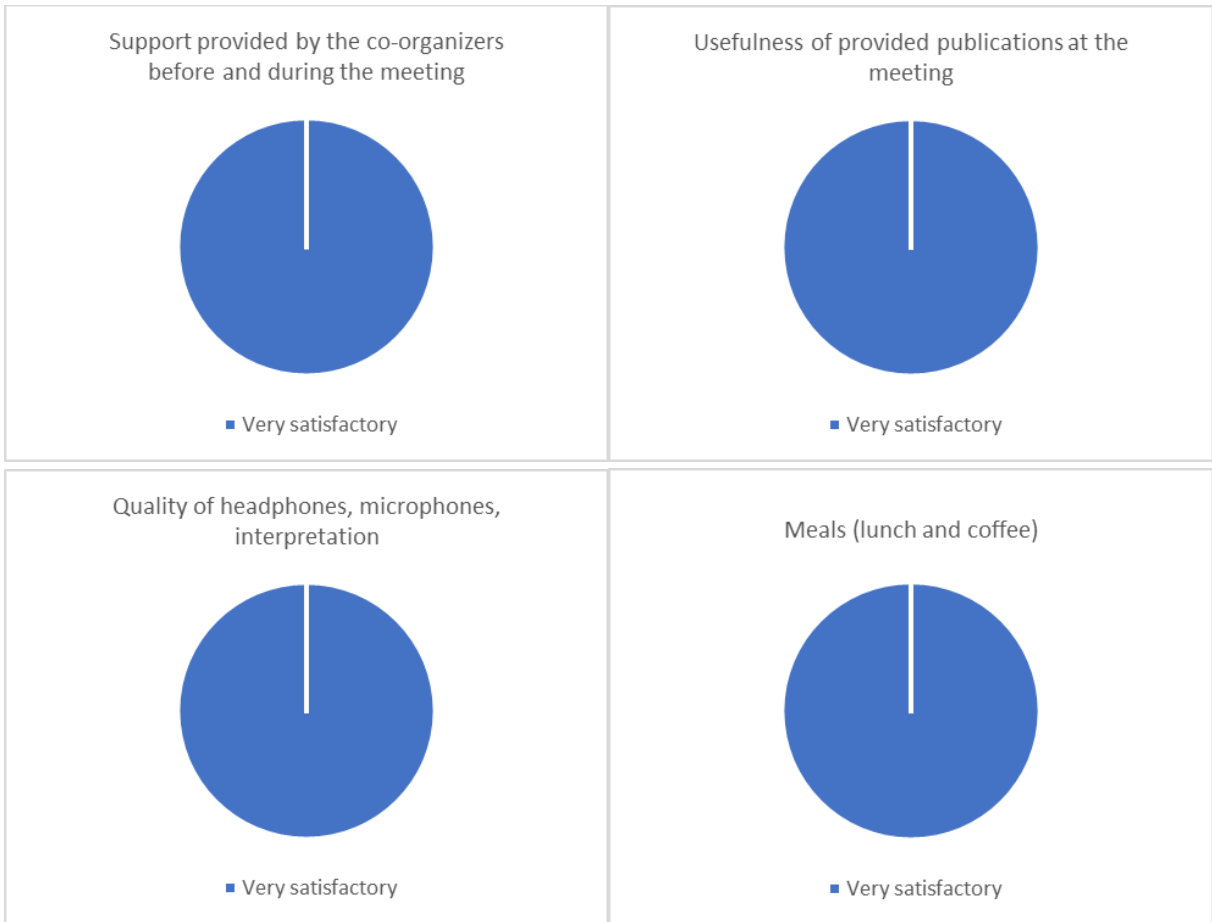
**Evaluation summary**

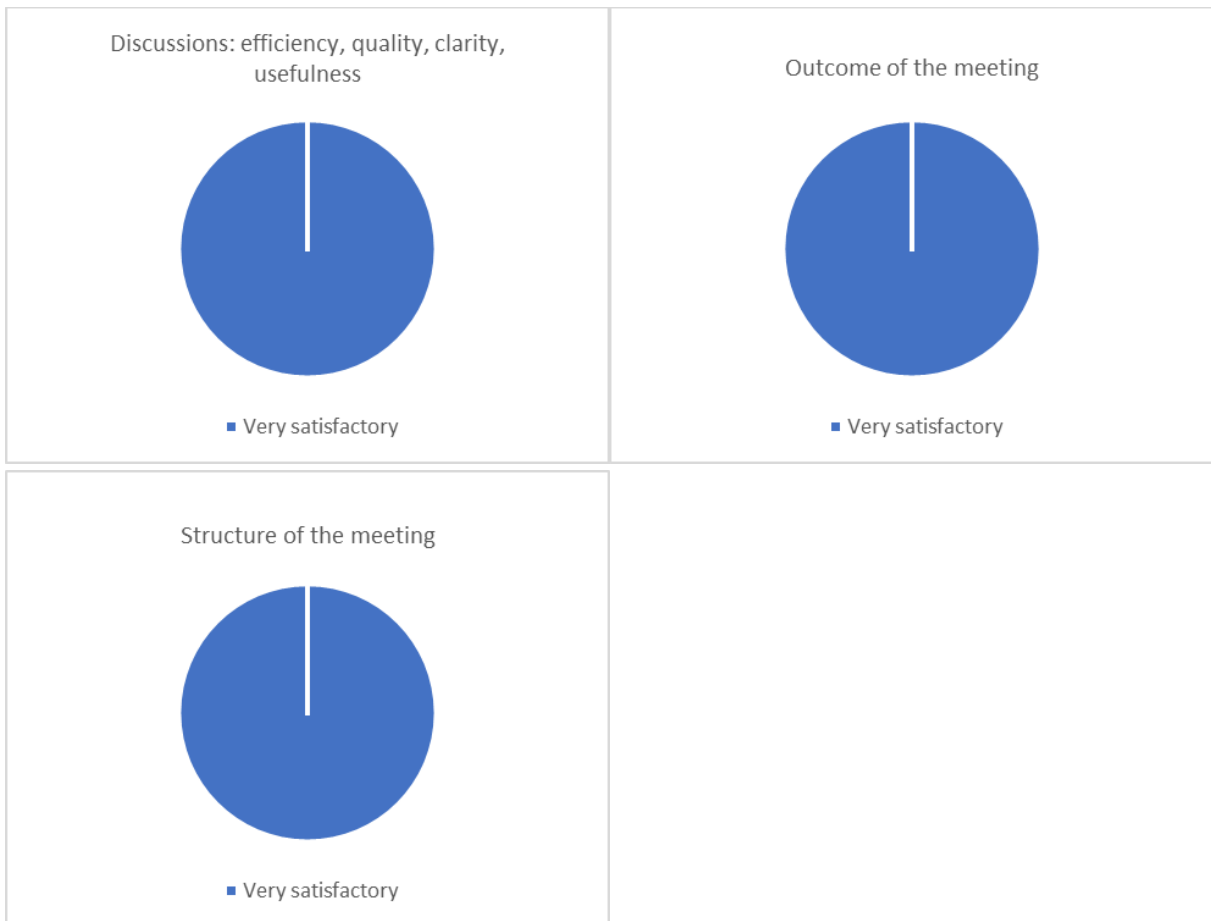
