About the Carpathian Region

- One of the largest mountain regions in Europe
- Providing essential ecosystem services and goods for 17 million of inhabitants
- Europe's last great wildernesses areas with exceptional levels of biodiversity
- Exceptional **cultural heritage** as distinguishing feature of the region in Europe and globally

Framework Convention on the Protection and Sustainable Development of the Carpathians

- Adopted in 2003, entered in force in 2006, ratified by all Carpathian countries
- A platform for cooperation, policy coordination, joint strategies for sustainable development + a forum for **dialogue between all stakeholders involved**
- UN Environment Vienna Office provides the Secretariat for the Convention

4 EDUCATION

Article 13 - Awareness raising, education and public participation


- 1. The Parties shall pursue policies aiming at increasing environmental awareness and improving access of the public to information on the protection and sustainable development of the Carpathians, and promoting related education curricula and programmes.
- 2. The Parties shall pursue policies guaranteeing public participation in decision-making relating to the protection and sustainable development of the Carpathians, and the implementation of this Convention.





Establishing the ESD network: a research-based approach

- ESD activities are regularly carried out under the Carpathian Convention
- Current ESD activities target various groups from youth to professionals and decision-makers
- ESD activities currently are not perceived as ESD by several actors
- The ESD activities are fragmented
- ESD is not prioritised in projects and proposals
