


Education and Awareness Raising of Legal Professionals on Access to Justice

Managed by ClientEarth and Justice & Environment





- targets legal professionals of the following MS: Austria, Estonia, France, Germany, Hungary, Poland, Slovakia, Spain
- different activities implemented in 9 countries of the EU (+ Belgium)



3-year project started in July 2017

- A monthly newsletter about the latest updates in A2J
- A <u>guide</u> on access to Justice EU procedural rules and <u>case</u> <u>law</u> and the Aarhus Convention equivalents
- National toolkits on access to justice in 8 Member States
- A <u>digital information platform</u> with an "ask a lawyer function"
- <u>A public-interest lawyer database</u> regrouping lawyers active in the field of environmental law
- A <u>series of webinars</u> and trainings held in different locations in eight member states
- An EU wide conference held in Brussels



- Monthly newsletter reached more than 700 subscribers by the end of the project: clicks on links were much higher than the typical industry average.
- English version of the guide was printed and distributed to 100 stakeholders, while 1759 stakeholders downloaded either the English or the Polish version.
- 2090 people attended these capacity-building events. 635 people watched recordings of the webinars.
- the international conference in Brussels was attended by 285 participants




impact of the project on the public interest lawyers
