12th Meeting of the Task Force on Target Setting and Reporting <u>Date</u>: 17th November 2021 Format: Hybrid (Geneva and Online)

<u>The Meeting was serviced</u> by the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) and the World Health Organisation Regional Office for Europe (WHO/Europe) Joint Secretariat of the Protocol.

 The Task Force reviewed progress by Parties and other States in setting, revising and implementing their targets, in accordance with Article 6 of the Protocol and welcomed the significant progress made by Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Germany, Portugal, the **Russian Federation and Spain.**

 The Task Force encouraged the use of the **Consultation Process under the Compliance Committee of the Protocol for Parties** requiring assistance in setting, revising and/or implementing their targets.

The Task Force encouraged Protocol Parties and other States to make use of the document: **"Protocol on Water and Health and the Covid-19 pandemic: relevance, lessons** learned and future perspectives" when setting and implementing COVID-19 sensitive targets on water, sanitation, hygiene and health.

- The Task Force launched the 5th Reporting Cycle under the Protocol and took note of the necessary preparations.
- It also examined the Reporting Template and the Guidelines; taking into account the 2030 Agenda, the Covid-19 pandemic, etc.

 The Task Force discussed the Future **Programme of Work of the Protocol for** 2023-2025 and it provided insights on thematic priorities, which should be considered and/or strengthened in the Future Programme of Work.

• The Task Force agreed to hold its next Meeting in Autumn 2023.



2. Strengthening Capacity to Monitor Progress and Reporting

- a) Based on the publication *Protocol on Water and Health and the 2030 Agenda: A Practical Guide for Joint Implementation*, promote the strengthening of synergies at the <u>regional</u> and <u>global</u> levels with processes related to the relevant SDGs.
- b) Facilitate reporting by Parties and other States, in accordance with article 7, and support data analysis at the regional level through the deployment of an Online Reporting System for the Sixth Reporting Cycle under the Protocol.

c) Guide the Secretariat in preparing the Regional Implementation Report. (not considered a priority according to the Survey Results)

Assist Parties and other States in setting targets, establishing action plans and implementing measures to achieve them through providing, upon demand and subject to the availability of resources, tailor-made support through relevant processes and projects:
