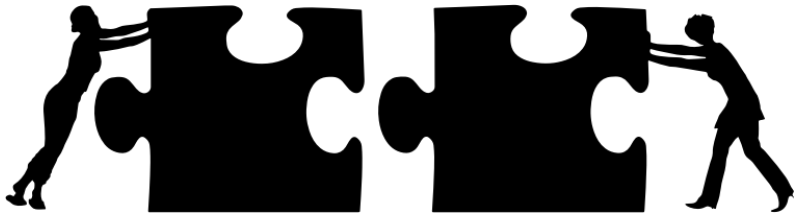

Insights from sprint sessions
