The Gender Declaration







The Declaration, "acknowledge[s] that representation of women in standards development is almost always below parity and that the outcomes for men and women are not explicitly addressed during the standards development process."

<u>Guidelines on Developing Gender-Responsive Standards:</u>

PURPOSE: To ensure that standards meet the needs of men and women by developing clear guidelines on the process to be followed to ensure standards are gender-responsive.

AUDIENCE: Standards developers, specifically people involved in the development and review of standards (i.e., technical committee chair and members).

Guidelines for Developing Gender-Responsive Standards



The guidelines focus on two areas:

- 1. How to increase representation of women on technical committees and ensure that meetings are inclusive to foster the participation of women in standards development.
- 2. How to ensure that standards are gender-responsive, regardless of the number of women participating on the technical committee.


