Report:

High-level launch of the UNECE Innovation for Sustainable Development Review (I4SDR) of Moldova and a capacity building programme to support implementation of selected recommendations

Thursday, 16 June 2022

### Background

Since its independence, Moldova has made significant steps to transition to a fully-fledged market economy with improvements in the business environment and development of its national innovation system. Further economic growth will mean that innovation in the form of systematic experimentation with ideas must take centre stage in Moldova's policy efforts. Innovation would also be crucial in meeting Moldova's commitments under the United Nations Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development, including the imperative to transition towards a more circular and inclusive economy and the resilient post-pandemic recovery.

To support Moldova's development efforts, the UNECE has carried out the **Innovation for Sustainable Development Review (I4SDR) of Moldova**. The I4SDR aims to support the national authorities and policymakers in promoting an enabling environment for innovation and knowledge-based competitiveness to foster sustainable development.

The I4SDR was carried out following a request from the Government of Moldova and with the financial support from the Government of Sweden. It contains recommendations aimed at stimulating innovation activity in the country through policy actions to enhance innovation policy governance, science-industry linkages and technology commercialisation, and the innovation and technology transfer infrastructure. For the first time, the I4SDR proposes possible policy solutions to leverage the Moldovan diaspora for innovation-driven sustainable development.

## Objectives

This event served as an opportunity to present Moldovan stakeholders and international partners with the final main findings and recommendations of the I4SDR of Moldova. It was also a platform to launch the capacity-building programme on innovation and technology transfer, as agreed with the Ministry of Education and Research. The capacity-building programme aimed is at supporting the implementation of the selected Review recommendations by the Government of Moldova.

#### Participation

This event brought together more than 70 people, including Moldovan Government representatives, academia and private sector representatives, as well as international experts, including authors of respective chapters of the I4SDR, development partners and the UNECE secretariat.



# Summary of the discussion

The opening session featured high-level speakers from the Government of Moldova, ECE and UNDP.

<u>Ms. Olga Algayerova, Under-Secretary-General and Executive Secretary, UNECE</u> opened the meeting highlighting the uncertain times facing Moldova and the region and the importance of innovation to improve lives and continue with progress towards achieving the sustainable development goals. Ms. Algayerova welcomed progress on the reforms achieved by the Government of Moldova and called to step up efforts on innovation policy governance and building the absorptive capacities of the private sector and R&D institutions, while re-iterating the commitment of UNECE to support further Government efforts in this direction.

Ms. Adriana Cazacu, Secretary of State, Ministry of Education and Research, Moldova thanked UNECE for the excellent work conducted under this Review and welcomed the actionable recommendations the analytical document provides. Ms. Cazacu highlighted the importance of the effective involvement and coordination of all innovation policy stakeholders in policy design and implementation to achieve results, including when it comes to building industry-science linkages, fostering innovation at the sub-national level and engaging the diaspora. The Secretary of State reiterated the Government's commitment to implementing the policy recommendations, including through the upcoming Roadmap on innovation and technology transfer to contribute to the new National Programme on Innovation and Research (2024-2027) and called relevant stakeholders to participate actively in consultations for the development of the Roadmap to be supported by UNECE. Mr. Simon Springett, Resident Coordinator of the United Nations in Moldova highlighted the timeliness of the Review in these challenging and uncertain times for Moldova and called for the integration of its main findings and recommendations into the national development strategy Vision 2030. Mr. Springett stressed the importance of an "all-government" approach to innovation policy to address sustainable development challenges and economic and social insecurity in the country. The Resident Coordinator welcomed Moldova's efforts to digitalise its state services noting at the same time fragmented efforts when it comes to innovation in the public sector, and the need to strengthen linkages between industry and R&D institutions while enhancing their absorptive capacities.

The session was followed by presentation of the main findings and recommendations of the Review by UNECE, i.e. <u>Mr. Christopher Athey, Economic Affairs Officer, Innovative Policies Development Section</u>, and <u>Ms. Lyudmyla Tautiyeva, Consultant, Innovative Policies Development Section</u>, and international experts, i.e. <u>Mr. Aleksandr V. Gevorkyan, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Economics, Tobin College of Business, St John's University, United States of America and Ms. Lisa Cowey, Expert on Technology Transfer at JRC and WIPO, Technology Transfer Interface Ltd (T3I), United Kingdom.</u>

In the discussions that followed, <u>Ms. Aliona Onofrei, Deputy Head of the Research and Innovation</u> <u>Policies Directorate, Ministry of Education and Research of Moldova</u>, thanked UNECE for the Review and highlighted the usefulness of the recommendations for further development of national innovation policy. Ms. Onofrei acknowledged the need to strengthen private sector absorptive capacities and the capabilities of the R&D institutions to provide quality research results with potential for commercialisation. She also stressed the importance of cooperation of all ministries and



agencies involved in innovation policy on one hand, and with sub-national authorities on the other. Priority directions for action for the Ministry include revision of the legal framework for innovation, enhancing innovation policy governance, development of effective and accessible innovation and technology transfer infrastructure, enhancing cooperation with EU on research and innovation, as well as building the capacities of Ministry staff to design and implement innovation policy. Ms. Onofrei pointed out that the Ministry has already started delivering on a range of recommendations provided under the ECE's Sub-regional Innovation Policy Outlook 2020 and current Review, namely the introduction of innovation vouchers, re-introduction of the young researcher programme, mapping the research and innovation and research institutions, finalising the smart specialisation strategy (to be one of the drivers of innovation at the sub-national level), etc. In conclusion, Ms. Onofrei called for the active participation of all relevant ministries and agencies, as well as the private sector and academia in the development of the Roadmap for innovation and Technology Transfer of Moldova, a key policy document to be embedded within the wider strategic policy framework for innovation.

Mr. Vadim latchevici, Head of Division of Innovation Projects, National Agency for Research and Development of Moldova agreed with the priority actions and suggestions announced by the Ministry of Education and Research, highlighting the usefulness of the Review and the commitment of NARD to implement its recommendations, including through the Roadmap to be developed.

<u>Ms. Violina Donu, Deputy Director, Diaspora Relations Bureau of Moldova</u> thanked ECE for the analysis of the diaspora in the Review and highlighted the relevance of the recommendations for the Bureau's work and strategic vision of diaspora engagement for development and innovation. Ms. Donu briefed participants on recent development of the diaspora academic profile and the guidebook on academic diaspora to ensure better engagement with this segment of the diaspora, along with plans to establish diaspora hubs (beginning in 2023) and a network of hometown associations (with UNDP support). She also explained that the Bureau had partnered with the Ministry of Education and Research and set up a platform for cooperation with the diaspora, maintaining flexible engagement frameworks with the diaspora, continued efforts to conduct an in-depth evaluation of the diaspora through questionnaires and other initiatives, as well as exploring the gender dimension of the diaspora, ramely the engagement of women for innovation and economic development in Moldova. Finally, she highlighted the need to establish a national data collection instrument that would allow accessibility and harmonization of data gathered by all ministries and agencies for a more informed, evidence based and coordinated policy approach.

Ms. Ilona Panurco, Business Regulation Consultant, Economic Council under the Prime Minister of Moldova welcomed the work undertaken by ECE in cooperation with the Ministry of Education and Research and pointed to the ambitious recommendations contained in the Review. On behalf of the Economic Council, Ms. Panurco indicated the readiness and commitment of the Council to support the implementation of these recommendations, including through the Roadmap on Innovation and Technology Transfer.



The following session was dedicated to the presentation of the concept, methodology and timeline of UNECE capacity building support to Moldova to support the implementation of selected recommendations. Based on the discussions and subsequent agreement with the Ministry of Education and Research, the capacity building will aim to support the development of the Roadmap on Innovation and Technology Transfer of Moldova and conducting follow-up training activities for policymakers. Ms. Lisa Cowey, Expert on Technology Transfer at JRC and WIPO, Technology Transfer Interface Ltd (T3I), United Kingdom and the international expert leading this capacity building, presented the concept, methodology and timeline of the project and inviting participants to comment. In the discussion that followed, the Diaspora Relations Bureau representative suggested including high-skilled diaspora members in consultations on the development of the Roadmap; the representative of ATIC (Association of ICT businesses in Moldova) expressed their readiness to be involved in the consultations process and stressed the need to discuss revision of the requirement of holding a PhD degree to teach at universities in Moldova (i.e. one of the reasons for low quality of ICT education); the representative of Endava, a private company, expressed an interest in taking part in the consultations and highlighted the need to invest in the skills of university graduates to close the gap with the labour market needs.

In closing, <u>Mr. Christopher Athey, Economic Affairs Officer, Innovative Policies Development Section,</u> <u>UNECE</u> thanked all stakeholders, experts and partners their contributions during the event and, most importantly, throughout the Review process. He reminded participants of the next steps under the project, i.e. the establishment of the Task Force to hold consultations on development of the Roadmap on Innovation and Technology Transfer and encouraged the active participation of all relevant innovation policy stakeholders.
