Protocol 6th Meeting of the Parties—16-18 November 2022



The Protocol on Water and Health: strengthening the resilience of WASH and health services in times of climate change and pandemics

Session objective:

- To provide an opportunity to appraise progress and take stock of the concrete results of countries'
 responses in ensuring access to water, sanitation, hygiene and health for all in the context of the
 COVID-19 pandemic
- To foster an open dialogue on how to tackle the persisting gaps and challenges posed by climate change in the pan-European region to create climate-resilient WASH and health services.
- The main outcomes of this session will be reflected in a summary of proposed actions and recommendations, which will be brought forward towards the UN Water Conference (New York, 22-24 March 2023)
- Other topics to be discussed at the MOP: improving governance for water and health, prevention and reduction of water-related diseases, safe management of water and sanitation systems, increasing resilience to climate change, financing for the new programme of work which will be adopted at the meeting

What is the Equitable Access-Score card?

Analytical tool to establish a baseline, track progress and prompt discussions to support the implementation of policies and practices.

The Score-card aims to assess i) the governance framework existing to achieve equitable access and ii) the existence of public policies to:



Reduce **geographical disparities**



Address the needs of vulnerable and marginalized groups



Ensure affordability in access to water and sanitation





Recent developments – Revision of the Equitable Access Score-Card



Why consider revising the Score-card?

- Original self-assessment methodology developed in 2011-13
- Since then, additional self-assessments in other 9 countries (after 3 pilots)
 - Consideration of lessons-learnt
- COVID-19: Key issues and lessons learnt to increase the resilience of the WASH sector in the context of potential future pandemics should be included









- You are invited to take part in the meeting, online or in-person
- UNECE- countries not yet Parties are encouraged to consider accession to the Protocol
- You are invited to make use of the guidance documents and practical tools developed under the Protocol
- Consider participating in the programme of work implementation
