- HLG-MOS have developed a set of models to support the modernisation of the official statistics
- We have GAMSO, GSBPM, GSIM, CSPA, CSDA as cornerstones of a collaborative modernisation plan
- These models can be used in combination with other standards in the statistical community to allow the creation of frameworks helping statistical offices in different tasks

Survey – 2021 edition



Conducted in February-April 2021;

Last survey was conducted in 2018



Invitation was sent to national statistics offices and statistical divisions of international organisations



43 national statistics offices (Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Palestine, China) + 2 intl' statistical offices (ECB, ILO) responded







Survey – 2021 edition

For each model (GSBPM, GAMSO, GSIM and CSPA) asked about maturity level:

- 1. No use or does not have intention to use [model]
- 2. A **few individuals** are becoming interested in the potential value of using [model] or developing a national version of [model]
- Use of [model] (or the national version of it) is basic and limited to a few individuals
- 4. Use of [model] (or the national version of it) is **spreading**, but practice varies between individuals and across units
- 5. There is a **widespread** awareness of [model] (or the national version of it) and a consistent approach to its use across the Organisation
- 6. [model] (or the national version of it) is **mature**, well understood, integrated into nearly all business processes and practices and used in a consistent manner across the organisation









Survey results

GSBPM



- Benefits: Ease of internal communication, facilitate quality management
- Difficulties: no difficulty, lack of human resources

GSIM



- Benefits: Facilitate reuse/sharing of methods, services; management of metadata
- Difficulties: lack of human resources









Survey results

- Benefits: Ease of internal/external communication
- Difficulties: lack of human resources

- Benefits: Facilitate reuse/sharing of methods, services; ease of internal communication
- Difficulties: lack of human resources and finance
